June 14, 2016 Jr. Rock Club Report by Olivia and Mrs. Trumbo

- Birthday celebration and gifts were for Mason, Aurora, and Olivia at the meeting of 15 students and 15 adults in attendance.
- Different Mineral of the Month reports were given by 5 students who bravely practiced their growing strength in public speaking skills too. See their reports below. Eight students want to do more research for the next meeting August 9th, as we don't meet in July, They include Olivia, Katie, Samantha, Marcus, Arthur, Eli, Lukas, and Andrew.
- We were thrilled to receive some large pieces of beautiful golden onyx for each family to add to their collection, giving a large round of applause for the donation by Terry Norton's generosity. Thanks Marvin for delivering the onyx to us.
- The evening was then filled by an exciting game learning rock hound safety basics. We give thanks to the club in Utah who shared it with Pat Lambert who taught the game to us. This game is a winner!

Calcite, by Marcus -age 8

- Calcite is found in Mexico.
- Its fizzing in dilute acids, for example hydrochloric acid, is a characteristic feature of calcite.
- Its hardness is 3.
- Its color is white and clear.

Moqui Marblesby Lukas -age 10

- First of all, Moqui marbles are found in Utah and Arizona. They are concretions of sandstone balls cemented by a very hard shell of iron oxide minerals. There were look-a-likes that were discovered on Mars and part of the difference was the name. The name of the look-a-likes was the so called Martian blueberries.
- Second, they were the color brown and they were hard rock mineral which is a Moqui marble.

Agate, by Noah -age 9

- Agate is used since prehistoric ages. The cavities of ancient volcanoes are where they form.
- Agate is associated with certain roperties. It is said to be effective for allergies, skin diseases and stress.
- Because of the rather porous nature, grey and white colors can be dyed.
- Hardness for this banded gemstone is 6.5 7 on the mohs scale.
- Held up to light, they can be translucent. Agates seem to have some specific significance associated with the 12th and 14th wedding nniversaries. They are gifted to couples who celebrate the completion of the 12 or 14 years of wedded life.

Agate Nodule, by Arthur -age 6

Agates form in igneous rock. Gases in cooling lava make holes. Water seeps into the holes. The water carries silicates, forming a lump or nodule. The nodule is denser than the basalt around it.

Agates, by Katie -age 8

- Agates come in many colors and each agate is different sizes and shapes. Agate is a mineral, a member of the quartz family associated with volcanic rocks. Many have parallel lines like my nodule agate.
- Agate is one of the most common minerals used in art. Many agates are hollow. Agates are commonly referred to geodes (a small cavity in rock lined with crystals or other mineral matter) and often full of quartz (a hard white or colorless mineral).
- 3 things that define an agate: **1.** Waxy on the outside **2.** Not see through, that means it's translucent, allowing light but not detailed images, to pass through **3.** Exhibits multi-color banding of any kind caused by different colors, with nodule shape color inclusions. That's all I want to tell you about agates. Any questions?

I will be leaving Friday afternoon, August 11th, and will be camping at Kaner Flatts Campground. Last year they advertised as \$12 per night for camping. This is the cheapest fee-camp area there and the spaces seem to be bigger. I have a large blue tent and a red Ford F150 Pickup. We are going to try to get the group camp spot which is located to the left when you enter the campground (Campground is located on the right side of the Little Naches Road. It's near the restroom with running water. It is first come, first serve, so hope to be able to get this and save on the cost. It's a large open area where several tents can camp. There are a few pull in spots for those who have RVs that are not far away, also.

We will meet at Kaner Flatts Campground at 10:00am, Saturday August 12th, and leave from there. Some may think this is late to start, but I only did that for those who are driving up from other locations that morning so they don't have to be up so early. I would like a list of those planning on attending so I don't leave before you all arrive. You will need rock picks, shovels, buckets, sack lunch, and plenty to drink. If you want to hunt for fossils, the best way to break the shale apart is with a metal paint spatula.

There are three locations we will go to. There is an area with blue thundereggs which you have to walk in about ¼ mile, uphill. The second is for the green rhyolite with tiny thundereggs. This is right in the road cut, so no hiking long distance. The third is in between these two locations which is for fossil leaves, pine needles and flowers.

For those planning on staying overnight, we will go to a fourth location Sunday morning, which is river walking for agate, jasper and thundereggs. It is overgrown and can be hard to maneuver in spots. Bring plenty of bug repellent.

Please contact me to be put on the list. If you send me an e-mail, I'll forward the map of the area to you. Hope to see you there! I will also bring a sign-up sheet to the August Meeting and samples to show what to expect. Anyone else who has prior-year finds, please bring and share, too:)
