

History and Significance This is one of a number of houses built by island carpenter, Albert Schlesselman, such as that of ERI-1595, Division St.; ERI-1690, Water St.; and ERI-1521, Huntington Ln. It was built for Adam J. Miller, farmer and grape-grower in 1907, and does not show many of the more elaborate architectural features evident in the above houses.
