100 YEARS of SOROPTIMIST and 65 YEARS of SIGP

These are milestones to celebrate! The first Soroptimist Club was founded 100 years ago in California. Soroptimist comes from the Latin soror-sister and optima-best, meaning “best for women.” Eighty dedicated women signed the first charter and chose to provide vocational guidance to girls as one of their first service projects. One hundred years later we are more than 72,000 women strong in 121 countries. All members work toward the same goal of empowering women and girls to dream big and to fulfill their dreams. Education is the key. Our Soroptimist mission is to provide women and girls with access to the education and training they need to achieve economic empowerment.

Soroptimist International of Grosse Pointe was founded in 1956 with 18 charter members. Sixty-five years later, with 62 members, we are a strong, active, diverse organization working together on many varied projects to educate and empower women and girls. Whether it is through our many educational awards, mentoring program, anti-human trafficking initiatives, providing tuition for high school girls in Ghana, the Dream It Be It program, or the important parenting classes and aid given to the women at Positive Images, we are proud of our accomplishments as Soroptimists.

We will be celebrating these two important anniversaries at our December holiday dinner. Save the date, Wednesday, December 8, 2021. Be prepared to enjoy the evening by looking back through our Soroptimist history.

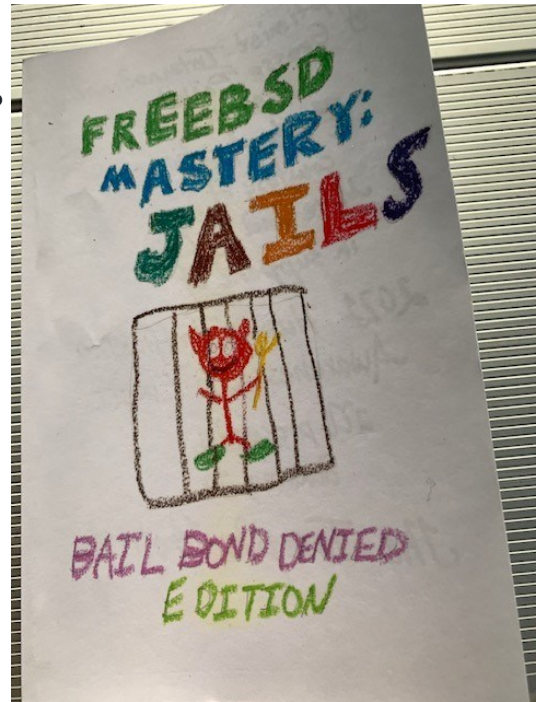
THE book that raised \$2,295 to help victims of human trafficking!

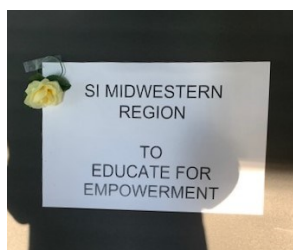

SIGP is now accepting applications for our Club's 2021 signature programs – **Live Your Dream** and the **Virginia Wagner Educational** awards. Each year we offer these educational awards to women enrolled in programs beyond high school. Once again, we are pleased to provide financial assistance to women who struggle financially to attend college or a vocational program and strive to complete their educational goals.

We provide information about these awards and how to apply to Financial Aid offices of colleges and universities in Macomb, Oakland and Wayne counties. However, I'm reaching out to you for help in finding qualified candidates for these awards. Word-of-mouth from SIGP members is important and beneficial. This is an important endeavor and getting this communication out is crucial.

The **LIVE YOUR DREAM AWARD** is for \$3000 and the applicant needs to be head of household, have financial need and be enrolled in any program past high school. **Applications are due by November 08, 2021.** (Flyer available to be copied and sent out is available on page 11.) The **VIRGINIA WAGNER EDUCATIONAL AWARD** is also for \$3000 and the applicant needs to be enrolled in a bachelor, master or doctorate program and has financial need. **Applications due by January 15, 2022.**

POSITIVE IMAGES has some positively positive news!

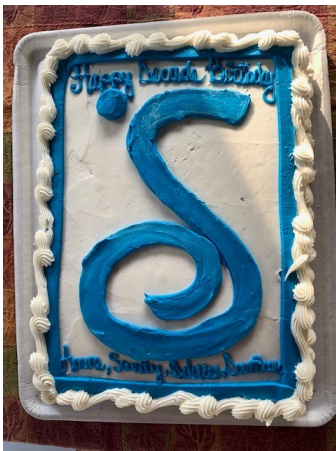
Positive Images has received a grant from the McGREGOR FOUNDATION for **\$150,000** to update and repair the building at 13336 E. Warren to expand its facilities to become the POSITIVE IMAGES FAMILY BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE CLINIC. Behavioral health refers to integrated care coordination for services and referrals relating to behavioral and mental health. The clinic will serve more than 350 residents of Detroit providing person-centered, multidisciplinary, evidence-based screening, assessment, diagnostics, treatment, and substance use disorder and prevention services in one convenient and family-friendly location.

The McGregor Foundation was founded by Tracy and Katherine McGregor in 1925 with a mission “to relieve the misfortunes and improve the wellbeing of humankind.” In Detroit, the foundation focuses on underserved communities and funds programs that will enhance the quality of life in those communities. Positive Images, Inc., is certainly one of those programs! Congratulations to Positive Images! Soroptimist looks forward to supporting your endeavors in this exemplary project!

Positive Images has also received a grant from the State of Michigan that will fund a certified pre-school for four-year-old children in the current daycare facility in the Coplin residence center. **If you know of anyone who would be interested in being the lead teacher, please contact Diana at 313-690-1515** and she will forward the information to Executive Director Maisha Kenyatta.
