Aloha Kakou,

I'm sitting here at my desk in my home office, on my "day off", trying to overcome my writer's block. I've been stuck since Saturday morning when I first heard the news of the eleven Jewish worshipers who were brutally and wickedly gunned down while attending services at Tree of Life Congregation in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. How can this be? I am at a loss for explanatory words.

So, I've made myself a cup of coffee, put my feet up so that they become my laptop "desk", and started typing. It's how I get "unstuck." Usually, I think the process is as important as the substance, but today the substance takes precedence. How can this be? This act of evil, perpetrated in a house of God?

This much I know: the Jews are the chosen People of God. Jesus was a Jew (which, of course, means he definitely was not white). Anti-Semitism, hatred of the Jews, has persisted for centuries, millenia; and acts of anti-Semitism have since 2016 increased in the United States by a staggering fifty-seven percent. So have acts of violence against others because of their race, religion, gender, gender identity, immigrant status and sexual orientation, just to name a few of the most traditional categories of discrimination. There are more.

And as I finish my cup of joe, I realize that I have had it. I have been dancing the dance, walking the line, tip-toeing through the tulips so as not to offend anyone in these divided times. Maybe to avoid conflict and its attendant messiness ... maybe to perpetuate a shallow, false sense of harmony and call it "luv."

I am done with that. I am done with making excuses for the increasingly vituperative rhetoric of hate and violence that has been spewing out of the mouths of religious, political and social leaders of this country these last few years.

Words matter. And the demagogic words that divide by fear-mongering, dehumanizing and belittling others must be openly called out for what they truly are: hate-speech. That speech has no place in our democratic republic. Nor in religion. When it comes from our leaders, it incites those on the fringes to violence. It moves the fringe to the mainstream. Now, we are reaping the whirlwind of hate and violence.

I don't exactly know what, when and how I'm going to be speaking up, but I feel now more than ever that to keep silent is wrong, sinful, and shameful. Enough is enough. Time to take my cross.

I'm tired of offering "thoughts and prayers" for victims of hate. If you are reading this, and you agree, please, please, please, please, let me know. Let's talk story. Let's plot, and plan. Let's do something. Together, as People of God, followers of Jesus, we can make a difference. Only together, humbly and vocally carrying our crosses, will we make a difference.
