What to know about W-2s

The 2018 tax season is right around the corner, and we want to be sure you know what to expect when it comes to your W-2s. All U.S.-based retirees will receive a paper 2018 W-2 at their mailing address on file, and it'll be postmarked by Jan. 31, 2019.

Don't forget that the IRS now requires us to report your income related to retiree travel on Form W-2. As a reminder, imputed income is the estimated value of a trip that is added to your taxable income to comply with IRS guidelines. It applies to travel by registered companions, non-dependent children, domestic partners and their children. Trips are valued for imputed income purposes based on mileage for each segment flown.
