NEW CITY CAMERA INSTALLED



A big **thank you to all the neighbors** who have helped advocate for improvements at the **dead end of Glenhill Drive**. Over the years, this area has faced recurring issues with illegal dumping — and thanks to everyone who kept it on the City's radar, it was selected for a **new surveillance camera** as part of Austin's citywide effort to curb dumping.

Earlier this year, **Austin City Council allocated \$463,000** to strengthen enforcement against

illegal dumping, and **Coronado Hills was among the neighborhoods chosen**. This means if dumping continues, the City can now **review video footage and issue fines** to those responsible.



Please continue using the **311 app** to report any dumping or similar concerns. You can also **email the CHCRNA board** with questions or updates — we'll work with you to **keep Coronado Hills safe and clean!**

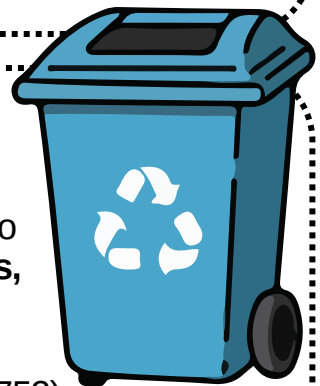

CALL FOR ADVICE ON CAST IRON PIPES

Many homes in Coronado Hills were **originally built with cast iron plumbing**, and over the years, several neighbors have had their pipes replaced or repaired. To help homeowners who haven't yet tackled this project, we're planning a **community discussion at our January meeting** where neighbors can share their **experiences, lessons learned, and contractor recommendations**.

SLOW IT DOWN

Some neighbors have asked us to share a friendly reminder to **drive slowly through our neighborhood**. We know our wide streets and rolling hills can make it tempting to speed, but **pets, wildlife, and pedestrians are all safer when we take it easy**.

Many of the speeding vehicles we've seen are **delivery drivers or pass-through traffic**, but every resident who slows down helps set the tone for safer streets. **Thank you for doing your part to keep Coronado Hills safe!**



QUICK SHARED STREETS PROJECT UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who joined our October meeting with **Ming-ru Chu**, transportation engineer with the City of Austin! Ming has already followed up on several of the issues neighbors raised:



- **Pedestrian Signs:** The "State Law – Stop for Pedestrians" signs **will be installed** at the new crossing islands before the project is considered complete.
- **Speed Limits:** The **30 mph signs on Glenhill and Brookhollow will be replaced with 25 mph signs** to create consistency throughout the neighborhood.
- **Painted Curbs:** Ming requested contact info from residents who flagged specific intersections (Pebblebrook Cove, Brookhollow Cove, and Coronado Hills Dr) so she can connect them with City staff for follow-up.
- **Reflective Markers:** The City will **add reflective markings to the new Brookhollow bump-outs** to improve nighttime visibility.
