

Four sheep will be used for the competition and identified as 1, 2, 3 and 4.

The time allowed for visual judging will be: sheep standing 7 minutes; sheep sitting 3 minutes; sheep standing 2 minutes; total 12 minutes. A further 6 minutes will be allowed for completion of card. Each competitor in the oral section is allowed 3 minutes to line up the animals and explain the reasons for their selections. Appropriate clothing must be worn. Entry form and score sheets available on show day.

Entry form and score sheets available on show day.

Competitors will be allowed 5 minutes to assess each fleece and to complete their judging cards. Competitors are allowed 2 minutes to explain their selections in the oral section. Appropriate clothing must be worn. Entry form and score sheets available on show day.

Beef Cattle Judging

Competitors must be over 15 and under 25 years of age on May 1 in the year of the State Final Championships at the Royal Easter Show. First and second place getters in this zone final will be eligible to compete at the Royal Easter Show.

Four animals will be used for the competition and identified as 1, 2, 3 and 4.

Competitors will be allowed 8 minutes to judge the four animals and to complete the judging card. Each competitor in the oral section is allowed 3 minutes for ringcraft and speaking. Appropriate clothing must be worn. Entry form and score sheets available on show day.

Due to the Beef Cattle Paraders Zone Final being given to Cooma Show, Nimmitabel Show will still hold the Beef Cattle Paraders but it won't be the Zone Final.

Beef Cattle Paraders (Not Zone Final)

Competitors must be 13 years and under 19 years of age on May 1 in the year of the State Final Championships at the Royal Easter Show. Competitors over 19 years and under 25 years can enter the Open Cattle Paraders in Sydney and competitors must lead a bull at any age. Each group final will be allowed to select from 3 to 10 finalists, depending on the number of entrants in the group final. Paraders may lead a steer, heifer or bull under 20 months. Paraders must be neatly attired and males expected to wear a tie. Shorts and thongs not permitted.

This competition is designed to select the parader who has prepared, presents and parades an animal before a judge most effectively. Entry form and score sheets available on show day.







250 g (8 oz) currants
125 g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel
90 g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries
90 g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds
250 g (8 oz) plain flour
60 g (2 oz) self-raising flour
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger	
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves	
250g (8 oz) butter	
250g (8 oz) soft brown sugar	
½ teaspoon lemon essence OR	
finely grated lemon rind	
½ teaspoon almond essence	
½ teaspoon vanilla essence	
4 large eggs	
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending on the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Here is what you do

- 1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least one hour, but preferably overnight.
- 2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
- 3. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support with a wooden spoon.
- 4. Place the mixture into a prepared 20cm (8") square tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 31/2-4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.


