Attendance

Meeting was turned over to Ev. Schumaker who presented the present plan being considered for construction of the Mill Creek Project. Schumaker stressed the importance of the support of the Spanish Valley Water and Sewer District and Moab City further stating that federal aid seemed almost unattainable . Schumaker did state that the State of Utah - Division of Water Resources would be here for meetings in April and would hopeful commit the State for a million dollars interest free loan to the Water Conservancy District. Schumaker stated the cost figures for the construction including pipe-line to the existing system would be around three million dollars.

Darwin Gilger stated the Spanish Valley Water & Sewer District were in the process of appling for federal funds for a sewer project and were also considering the possibility of bonding. Gilger stated he wished the projects could be combined Gilger further stated he could see no controversy with the Spanish Valley Water District in the Construction of the current project. Gilger further stated the cost now being considered or tentative cost for the sewage would be around two million.


Bill McDougald stated the City was certainly looking
