






Fall Cruise

After the we landed, some headed to a local ice cream shop to finish off a great trip.




CONVERTIBLE TOP ZIPPER LUBE

In an edition of Boating magazine they discussed the issue of zipper lube. They recommend simple candle wax or crayon for zipper lubricants and snaps, additionally they also recommend a commercially available lubricant from a company called "Starbrite" Snap and Zipper Lubricant, which comes in clear form. This has been the same recommendation from this magazine for the past 10 years or so. Vaseline also helps as well as beeswax for an even smoother and longer lasting and less greasy!



AIR CLEANER CORK

To prevent your **NEW** air cleaner cork from looking like the one pictured Remove the old cork from the channel - DO NOT remove the original staples.. Clean the old cork out. Cut 3/8 inch off the BOTTOM of the new cork then notch the new cork at the staple locations. Then slide the new cork in the channel. This way if you ever want to change the cork again all you have to do is slide it out. Will look original and not mess up the under hood paint, If you decide to make new staples, they are easy to make using paper clips and a pair of pliers.
