He was honorably discharged on Dec. 27, 1945, at Fort Sheridan, Ill.

He farmed for several years and was appointed rural mail carrier at the Sebewaing Post Office on Aug. 11, 1957. He retired on Jan. 3, 1986, after 28 years on the same mail route.

Claude was a lifelong member of St. John Lutheran Church in Kilmanagh. He was church treasurer for some years and served as Sunday school superintendent for 25 years.

Hobbies include avid book reading and collecting stamps since 1957. He was the pioneer of card playing at the Hornbacher family gatherings. He loved to play with his children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, especially Ryan and Luke. He served on the Board of Directors of the Sebewaing Co-op for 21 years. He was chairman of the Sebewaing Township Library Board for many years. He was a lifelong member of the National Rural Letter Carriers Association and a life member of the American Legion.
