Congratulations to our Scholarship Winners

This year's four scholarship recipients were chosen based on their outstanding academic achievement, a written personal statement, an essay on a current social issue, recommendations, and participation in extracurricular activities.

Emmet Starowicz, a Westhill graduate, has been accepted at SUNY Oswego in the Childhood Education Program. His grandfather, Craig DeForest, a Westhill retiree, was his sponsor. Emmet will be continuing in the family business of teaching, and one of the first to study elementary education. Emmet has successfully completed enough credits at OCC to satisfy freshman year requirements. He credits his interest in musical theater to Kathy Tompkins, his elementary music teacher. Participation in this activity helped to build his selfconfidence. Emmet has been described as an all-around student. He has participated in school musicals, soccer, basketball, lacrosse, student government, Academic Decathlon, Future Educator's Club, and Catholic Faith Formation. For his outstanding achievements he was chosen as the recipient of the Neal Sorkin Scholarship, given in Neal's memory by his wife, Carol Sorkin.


