8. New Business

- a. Cedar Cove Social Committee presented a proposal to build a basketball area in the hamlet of Moose Bay. Following the presentation and discussion, Dave Gordecki moved that the proposal by Cedar Cove Social Committee be supported by the hamlet of Mosse Bay but the hamlet have no responsibility for the project. Seconded by Murry Shacklton. Everyone in favour. Greg Walchuk moved we donate \$500.00 to the project once all approvals have been granted. Seconded by Grant Theriault. All in favour
- b. Mike Lang provided an update regarding the proposed improvements at the Waste Management Site.
 - i. RFNOW is planning to build a building there
 - ii. Clean up of the site will be the responsibility the RM of Grayson
 - iii. Installation of a camera system and a fence; each household would be given a passcode to be allowed entry, the cost incurred for the garbage would then need to be etransferred to the RM office. This would be monitored by the RM staff and anyone not complying with the rules would lose the privilege of the passcode for entry.
