



Greetings from your Parish Nurse!

It's June already, and we are entering the hottest and most challenging time of the year here in Arizona. I hope that you are already anticipating ways of reducing the stress of the summer months and temperature on your body.

I want to share a few ideas:

Plan your most demanding activities for early morning, or late in the evening when the temperatures drop a bit. Whether it is lawn work, housecleaning or walking, plan it when it is cool.

Drink plenty of water—you will need to continually replace fluids in your system when the temperature is over 100. Soda, coffee, alcohol, or fruit juices just won't do the job of keeping you hydrated! These fluids all have some properties that work to dehydrate you by acting on your kidneys to put out more water. Stick with water - either iced or room temperature. If you can't tolerate straight water, put in just a splash of a fruit juice or lemonade. It makes it much more tolerable.

Try a new activity in the water. We have such a great opportunity with our recreation centers to enjoy a swimming pool. The water is kept warm, but it is still cooler than body temperature. Staying in the water not only cools you for the moment, but it actually lowers your core temperature and keeps you cooler for a time up to several hours after the activity. You don't have to be able to swim. There are walking pools, or just find a spot to float while staying in the water. Is goes a long way to helping you cool down. I find that even the area around the pool at Fairway Rec Center stays at least 10 degrees cooler than the outdoor temperature. Some people "hang out" and read or play cards and enjoy the break in the heat.

I hope you will share more ideas with me as we face this hot summer! Enjoy and be safe!




