Let's pray; "Heavenly Father, I know that You want me to share these things with the Overcomers for Strist family. Just like Jesus shared His life's experiences with us, through Your Word, to better help us maneuver through our everyday lives, I truly believe that these visions, dreams and testimonies will show my brothers and sisters that they too can overcome satan by the Blood of the Lamb and the words of their testimonies. Father, I thank You for giving us all such great and precious promises, in Christ Jesus! And Father, help my brothers and sisters to see themselves as overcomers, and not allow themselves to stay deceived by the lies of the evil one. Father, You know that NONE of what I've written in any message is to glorify me. To You and You alone be all glory and honor! Help us, the OC+C family, to only listen and obey Your voice. I thank You for these things, in the Mighty name of Jesus! Amen!"

Throughout these messages I've mentioned the two different battles I've had, over the years, with ulcerative colitis. And just as I suspected, as I was about to share this 3rd event of UC with all of you, Holy Spirit tapped on my heart to share another, different experience/testimony with you. (I guess we'll get to that later.) I've shared this testimony with a few of the brothers that I correspond with, but I've never shared this in a newsletter because I felt at the time, it to be too personal of an experience. But, because Holy Spirit brought it up, there must be someone reading this testimony that it will have an effect on or even encourage 'you'. With the Holy Spirit's leadership, I'll share it. I usually do have a general direction we're headed, but I never know exactly how we're going to get there. I assure you; this is NOT a rabbit trail.

From the very first ulcerative colitis attack that I encountered, in 2008 and 2009, God directed me to a great doctor who has since been my primary care physician. We both love Jesus and always share our faith. Over the years we have become more like personal friends than a doctor patient relationship. When my body comes under attack, he always assures me, "This will not prevail over you because your body knows how to heal itself!" Being that 'they' say I'm not a spring chicken anymore, he always watches my blood work intently to make sure my insides are as healthy as my outside appears to be. Even though my faith is in the finished works of Jesus, Doctor Mo has been monitoring my insides for close to 16 years now.

At this point, I'd done some bloodwork the week before and went back to visit Dr. Mo for the results. As we went through all of the results he seen the PSA levels, which is only detected in the blood, and mentioned that this level had slightly elevated over the past year. To be proactive, he gave me a referral to a highly recommended Urologist. I always share my faith with my doctors to let them know that I **KNOW** Jesus is my true source of hope. In that, many times they will let me know where they stand one way or the other. This Urologist was also a believer and follower of Christ Jesus. After our first meeting he set me up with an appointment to come in and take some biopsies of my prostate. Let me add right here, guys, it doesn't matter how healthy you appear on the outside, the truth is always revealed in the blood. With the biopsies taken and sent out for the results, the next appointment would be for me to learn the results.

I went to this visit alone, but Michelle was waiting for me to call after the appointment to let her know the test results. As we went into his office, we greeted each other and sat down. He didn't beat around the bush, he got right to it and told me, "I do have the test results, and they show positive for prostate cancer. But the good news is I believe that we've detected it at an early stage, and it's confined to one area." (Thank You Jesus and thanks to Dr. Mo for watching my bloodwork so closely!) I'm not kidding you a bit, hearing the word 'cancer' caused the whole room to go black. As he started to tell me about his plan of attack, I looked at him and said, "Wait a minute. Don't tell me anything more. Just give me a minute to process this and pray for a minute." He did just that. The reason that I stopped and prayed was to paint a different picture in my imagination than the 'FEAR' that first started to come over me. After I had pushed the negative thoughts from my mind, I looked at him and said, "Okay, now let's hear what you recommend for the treatment."

He fully understood where I was in all of this 'news' and walked me through a couple different options. The first was to not do anything about it and maybe have five years, with a not so good ending. I stopped him right there and told him. "Listen, I have way too much on my plate to settle for a measly five years. That's too selfish for me to even think about. I have a wonderful family I love deeply. I have grandsons that I'm planning on watching grow up to give me some great grandchildren! On top of these things, I'm following God's plan for my life, and I am going to run that race and finish strong! Now tell me what the other option is."

The next option was to remove every place they saw the cancer, only do radiation, no chemo, and get on with my life like it never happened. I believe the reason no chemo was involved in this option was for the fact that God had directed Dr. Mo to keep an eye on me, and it was caught at an early stage. We talked about what I could expect, and what the treatments would look like. I told him I would discuss this with my wife and let him know the route we wanted to take. He understood my decision and told me he would wait to hear from me.

Knowing that Michelle was waiting to hear from me, as soon as I got in the car, I called her and told her the results were positive for cancer. Hearing the news, she started to cry. That was when I told her, "Listen, you can go ahead and cry this

one time, but WE WILL NEVER CRY ABOUT THIS AGAIN!" Within a couple of seconds, she stopped crying, and I proceeded to tell her the doctor's plan. We agreed that Jesus was my Healer and all we needed to do was to stay in faith, stay focused on Him, with what He has already done in our lives and walk with expectancy for what He was about to do in this season as well. I will tell you, honestly, my head tried to take me places I didn't want to go, but we never shed another tear about this again.

After I'd gone through the operation and in the recovery room the surgeon/Urologist came in and told us that after he removed those certain areas, he realized it had spread further than he first thought. But we were still early enough that he was able to get **ALL** of it out. After a few days at home, he called and set me up with a great Radiologist. Going into this next phase of treatment I was already confident that this was a done deal. This Radiologist then scheduled me for 5 treatments a week for eight weeks. That's forty treatments. I asked about my restrictions while this was going on, and he assured me that I could continue with whatever activities I normally did. I guess in their defense I should always let them know that I have no regulator on my 'doing' things. It's either off or **FULL ON**!

I came home from every treatment and did everything I had planned to do before this all occurred. I had scheduled for a concrete man to come pour a completely new driveway area for us. But, in order for him to do that I had planned to first lay a brick sidewalk ahead of the driveway. I had the forms all staked out so that he could continue with his part. A few days after he completed his part, I started my part, again. Of course it was over 100 degrees outside, but 'I had a plan!' You'll see that this is a theme in all of my 'doing'. By now we were in the 7th and 8th week of radiation treatment. At that point I started to realize that my groin area was beginning to feel sore. So, I asked this Radiologist if this could have anything to do with these treatments. He assured me it wasn't. SO NOW WHAT'S GOING ON?? Come to find out, the 'overachiever' in me had overdone it and NOW I had a hemia! Even though the hemia was pretty painful, it was a quick fix. Michelle and I are always on the same page with our faith and within a couple of months, we were on the other side of it all, and running stronger than ever! And to this date, the PSA levels in my bloodwork are nearly undetectable.

I'm not going to sit here and attempt to have you think that as a man this was not a huge thing for me to overcome, in my head. **MANY** times, my head went in so many directions and every direction was doing its best to lie to me. Let me straighten that up, some of it was the truth, but not the whole truth. That's the way the liar rolls, he only speaks partial truth to get our minds to wander down a dark path! The things that played over and over in my head could have been a reality in someone else's life, but it wasn't going to be my reality! I was just not going to let pride, concerning this issue, have its way in me! And as hard as it was from time to time, I had to stay focused on Jesus, His promises and His plan for my life. As soon as I got my head wrapped around the whole truth, that with or without a prostate Michelle and I were secure in our relationship I could then see that God's plan for me hadn't changed. So, I picked myself up and continued to march forward. Without me ever mentioning it, and you all not even knowing it, it was all of you, your mail and this newsletter that helped me keep my focus on Jesus. I continually thanked God for all of you and this assignment while I moved on. I was diagnosed with this in 2013, and I was determined cancer free, not remission, in 2014! That was ten years ago, not the measly five years that the first option offered me. God's plan is always the best plan. **PRAISE JESUS!**

I guess I'll give you all a break right here. With that, remember, there's a vicious world around us trying to steal away the Word we have inside of us! The devil is on the prowl trying get us to believe, like 'Chicken Little', the sky is falling and the world around us is hopeless! Don't fall for those lies. And to that I say, the laborers are few **BUT** the harvest is great for ministering! It's time to suit up and stand up! Be bold as a lion and share the Word that you have inside of you! Be kind to one another and love one another.

Remember, this earth is NOT a Christian's final destination. We are NOT hopeless, we already have a place prepared for us, in heaven! Jesus said so!!

Hello, my family in Jesus!!! Well, it's awesome to hear from you in this email format. It's better for me to talk this way with you, cheaper and easier! D.O.C. gives us ten free stamps a month!!! Well, I am doing OK, I am still a loving child of GOD!! I read my Bible every day and pray a lot. D.O.C. has opened the yard, so we are able to hold a Bible study or church every night on the yard!! It's awesome to see Jesus working in this place!!! I just finished reading the Overcomer for Christ August issue, and I am going to take it to church tonight and pass it on. Again, I am really happy to hear from you and love this better than writing. I always keep you and your loved ones in my prayers!!! Jesus is awesome and He IS MY Lord and Savior!!! Hosea 10:1-13:16

As you proser, consider where your money is going. Is it being used for God's purposes, or are you consuming it all on yourself? (10:1)

2 John 1-13

The statement that Christians should love one another is a recurrent New Testament theme. Yet love for one's neighbor is an old command, first appearing in the Book of Moses. Leviticus 19:18 – "You shall not take vengeance, nor bear any grudge against the children of your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the Lord." We can show love in many ways, by avoiding prejudice and discrimination, by accepting people, by listening, helping, giving, serving, and refusing to judge. Knowing God's command is not enough. We must put it into practice. Doing what God has commanded us. (1:5-6)

October 19th - In 2003, Mother Teresa was beatified by Pope John Paul II.

October 25th – In 1986, the New York Mets defeated the Boston Red Sox in Game 6 of the World Series after a routine ground ball rolled between the legs of Boston first-baseman Bill Buckner, allowing the winning run and capping the Mets' 10th-inning, come-from-behind victory. The Mets won Game 7 two nights later to earn the championship.

October 26th - In 1774, the first Continental Congress adjourned in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

October 26th – In 1881, the legendary shootout between American lawmen and outlaw cowboys near the O.K. Corral in Tombstone, Arizona territory, left three men dead.

October 26th - In 2001, U.S. President George W. Bush signed the anti-terrorism USA Patriot Act into law.

October 26th – In 2002, Russian special forces raided a theater in Moscow where Chechen separatists had held hundreds of patrons hostage for nearly three days. More than 130 hostages and all forty militants were killed.

WORD OF THE MONTH

Compurgator

Pronunciation - com·pur·ga·tor - 'käm per gå ter

Noun - one who under oath vouches for the character or conduct of an accused person

"Brought in as compurgators, the three character witnesses insisted that the defendant was a moral person and could not have committed the theft."

Did You Know ... Compurgator is a descendent of the Latin verb compurgare, meaning "to purify wholly". The root of that word, purgare, also gave English purge ("to clear of guilt," "to cause evacuation from," or "to get rid of") and expurgate ("to cleanse of something morally harmful, offensive, or erroneous"). Compurgator has occasionally been used in a more general sense of "one who supports or defends another," but its primary application is to the specific legal situation in which someone appears in court as a character witness for the defendant. Compurgator has been used in English with this specific legal meaning since the 16th century.

Did You Know?

Approximately 73% of the Israeli population is Jewish. Approximately 21% are Israeli citizens classified as Arab, some identifying as Palestinian, Druze, Circassians, all other Muslims, Christian Arabs, or Armenians. An additional 6% are classified as "others". This diverse group comprises those with Jewish ancestry but not recognized as Jewish by religious law, non-Jewish family members of Jewish immigrants, Christians other than Arabs and Armenians, and residents without a distinct ethnic or religious categorization.
