On November 6, we will host our annual Shabbat Kristallnacht remembrance service with the liturgy and music this year specifically focusing on the Berlin Jewish Community (Gemeinde) in Germany. I set the focus this year on this specific city's Jewish community because of my recent acquaintance with their new Hazzan, Isidoro Abramowicz, of the most prestigious synagogue in Berlin currently which is on Pestallozzistrasse (Pestallozzi Street—

synagogues in Europe are named after the street they are on) in the high end Western Berlin neighborhood known as Charlottenburg (similar to West Los Angeles or Beverly Hills here).

Hazzan Abramowicz is also the Dean of the Geiger Berlin school of Cantorial Studies and has graciously shared with me the entire book of the community's music for Shabbat recently. Many pieces of the music from this volume (which is all hand written, I might add) will be heard during our service including pieces that have never been heard in our synagogue before, but may be familiar to some of our members who grew up in Berlin.

I will be speaking about Kristallnacht and its implications in today's society during the service as well and paying tribute to our gallant co-religionists who stood up to Nazi tyranny and suffered tremendously during its reign of terror. I know you will want to join me in experiencing this wonderful reflection of a great Jewish community that flourishes today as it once did pre-holocaust.




