McKean County 4-H/FFA Livestock Guidelines

Eligibility to Sell:

- The boy or girl must be a member of a McKean County 4-H Club.
- A member must attend at least 60% of the clubs business and educational meetings and must be registered with a 4-H club by March 1st Exceptions will be made for those enrolled in college.
- Steers must be at least 50% of an established beef breed and exhibit beef characteristics.
- Must attend one <u>entire</u> livestock county-wide meeting.

County Requirements:

Pennsylvania 4-H State Policy states that a 4-H member cannot carry the same project in more than one county. For example: A member could not enroll in a beef project in X County and also enroll in a beef project in Y county. Any project taken for sale and/or competition in McKean County cannot be taken in another county, and any project taken in another county cannot be entered under 4-H in McKean County.

All members must have McKean County 4-H/Youth Livestock Exhibitors Code of Ethics and McKean County 4-H Livestock Guidelines form on file with the proper signatures to be eligible for the show and sale. All exhibitors must have completed Quality Animal Management (Quality Assurance) training (for livestock) by July 1st of the current year.

The 4-H member should care for (feed, exercise, and handle) the animal the majority of the time. Adults should not do the majority of the work. The 4-H member may have appropriate involvement or assistance from an adult. All pens must be cleaned by Sunday morning at the end of fair week or members will lose \$10.00 per pen from their checks.

Project Books:

Use approved 4-H curriculum obtained from your county 4-H Extension Educator. Project books may be entered in the fair for judging; however, in order to complete the project, 4-H members MUST complete the final budget page in their record book by 9 p.m. on Saturday at the end of fair week in order to receive their sale checks. The sale checks from the livestock auction will be distributed upon receiving the exhibitors completed project record book.

Number of Project Animals Permitted in 4-H Show and Sale:

Three animals per member may be entered and exhibited in the 4-H Show and Sale. Members may choose a maximum of two (2) animals per species, except beef, in which case one beef may be exhibited. If a member registered extra animals and one of the first three (3) is underweight at fair, he/she may weigh in an extra registered project animal if it is present at weigh-in. The first three (3) animals to make weight are the project animals, following the usual species restrictions. Any additional animals may be entered in the open/youth class. To be eligible for sale, member must enter in showmanship and fitting and have completed a project book and record book per species. Exhibitors who are enrolled in college, members with a doctor excuse or who are physically unable to exhibit their projects are exempt from participating in the show. The livestock committee must be notified prior and a substitute showman will be permitted.

Dress Code:

The following dress code will be followed at all functions sponsored by the Livestock Committee during fair:

- Black pants or dark jeans (black or deep blue)
- Livestock shirts (as supplied by the Livestock Committee)
- No hats
- No open toe shoes
- Steel toe shoes recommended for beef exhibitors

Registration Deadlines for Project Animals:

Steers October 31st (or last business day of the month)
Swine April 30th (or last business day of the month)
Lambs April 30th (or last business day of the month)
Goats April 30th (or last business day of the month)
Tagging will be on the first Saturday following registration date

Steers - first Saturday in November Swine/Lambs/Goats - first Saturday in May

Suggestions for Selection of Livestock

Steers: Suggested starting weight ranges 450-750 lbs. at 282 days out from the show to reach ideal market weight. The average weight gain per day for beef cattle is: 2lbs – 2.5lbs per day. Ideal market weight: 1150 – 1350 lbs. Swine: Suggested starting weight ranges 50-80 lbs. at 100 days out from the show to reach ideal market weight. The average weight gain per day for swine is: 1.6lbs – 1.8lbs per day. Ideal market weight: 230 – 280 lbs. Lambs: Suggested starting weight ranges 40-75 lbs. at 100 days out from the show to reach ideal market weight. The average weight gain for lambs is: 7lb-1lb per day. Ideal market weight: 90 – 130 lbs. Goats: Suggested starting weight ranges 20-55 lbs. at 100 days out from the

<u>Goats:</u> Suggested starting weight ranges 20-55 lbs. at 100 days out from the show to reach ideal market weight. The average weight gain is 3lbs per week. Ideal Market weight: 70 – 110 lbs.

Animal Age

- · Steers: Born after January 1st in the year preceding the show
- Swine: Born after January 1st of the year of the show
- Lambs: Born after January 1st of the year of the show
- Goats: Born after November 1st of the year preceding the show

Tagging and Sale Weights:

The 4-H member is to contact the McKean County Extension Office by announced deadline to register their animals. Animals must be brought to the fairgrounds at set time and place for weighing and tagging; tagging must conform to McKean County Fair rules and regulations. All animals are to be identified by a tag (provided by Livestock Committee). If a tag is lost, the member must notify the tagging committee. Member must show the animal(s) that was registered to that individual at the time of weigh-in. Sheep and goats must have a scrapie tag prior to being able to weigh-in and receive a fair tag.

Market Weight Divisions:

Class division will be left to the discretion of the 4-H Livestock Committee

Lightweight, Middle weight, Heavyweight

Horns/Castration:

- Steers: No horns and castrated by the date the animal is weighed in and tagged.
- Swine: Castrated by the date the animal is weighed in and tagged.
- <u>Lambs:</u> Castrated by the date the animal is weighed in and tagged.
- Goats: Castrated by the date the animal is weighed in and tagged.

Advertising:

A \$10.00 fee per animal will be charged to the youth *to support hauling fees of animals and the scholarship fund*. Four percent (4%) is the current rate for the committee's operating costs, which may be reviewed annually.

4-H Members must have passed their eighth birthday but not have passed their nineteenth birthday by January 1 of the current year. Exhibitors must be a McKean County 4-H member by June 1st carrying a project in the field in which they wish to make an entry, and be under the supervision of the Pennsylvania State University Cooperative Extension Service preceding the fair. Students enrolled in an accepted vocational school curriculum must be conducting a project in the class in which they wish to make an entry. Students enrolled in general home economics in a comprehensive high school are considered as qualify. All entries shall be approved prior to the Fair by a member of the Pennsylvania Department of Education, Agriculture or Home Economics staff or their designated representative.

4-H Members must be enrolled in a McKean County 4-H Horse Program to be eligible to compete in this area. The animal must be the member's 4-H production or project animal registered with the Extension Office in the current year with a statement from the Extension Office stating that the animal has been registered in the name of the 4-H member participating. Entries are limited to members of McKean County 4-H Light Horse and Pony Clubs. Exhibitors must show membership cards and must enter only project animals. May show both English and Western. ASTM Approved Helmets must be worn for all riding

classes.
