Selectpersons didn't discuss the relative merits of the three candidates at their Monday mee other than to say the interviewees were all very strong.

Part of their reluctance was based on a desire to keep negative comments — however inadvertent — off the public record about the applicants.

Selectperson William Whitmore said he followed up the interviews on Saturday with some reference checks.

He said he made seven calls in all and found them "very productive." Whitmore said feedbackwas positive on all three candidates.

"The most frequent comment I got was, 'I wish I could keep them here,'" he said.

Selectperson Bill Craft said he had one preferred candidate in mind but could see himself wo with all three of the finalists.

"It was a really interesting experience, and it was very fortunate to have so many well quali candidates," said selectperson Linda Alexson, who was also a member of the town manager screening committee.

Craft asked Lynch if the board should rank the finalists, in case one took an offer elsewhere

Lynch replied that he didn't foresee that problem, adding, "Each of the candidates remains vectors to Ipswich as their number-one choice."

Craft, Lynch, and temporary town manager Jim Engel will work out contract details with Mai

Lynch said most town manager contracts are standard in the state nowadays.

Selectperson Nishan Mootafian made the motion to hire Marino, and selectperson Ed Rausch seconded it.
