

In our denomination, a pastoral change is a possibility any given year, so it is truly a joy to know for sure now that we will be staying here for another year. I wouldn't want to be anywhere else. There are many reasons why we are so happy here, but the biggest reason of all is you. You, the people of this Church, have walked some long and difficult journeys with us, and we have walked some long and difficult journeys with some of you. Your loving care is amazing and we appreciate you all so much. It is because of all of you that we have and will continue to experience growth here in this Church. That growth will be very obvious in June.

In our three years together, we have welcomed over twenty new disciples into the life of this church, and this June we will be welcoming even more! We will begin the month of June with a New Members Service, and then on the second Sunday of June we will confirm eight new members. To grow in such great numbers is a wonderful sight, but this church has grown in more than just numbers. What gets me the most excited is when I see our new members actively involved in the missions and the worship of the church. So many of our new members have stepped up and done great things for God through the ministries of this church showing that they understand that membership in the church is about more than just attendance. That is a lesson we have been stressing to our eight confirmation students as well.

Our eight confirmation students have been attending weekly classes since January. That means that by the time they are done, they will have successfully completed a six-month long confirmation class. That is amazing! I know that sports, school, homework and other commitments made it hard for them to be a part of this class and live up to the covenant that we all wrote and signed together at our first meeting. But each of them had proven that they take their faith and their participation in the church seriously. As I said before, membership in the church is about more than just attendance. Likewise, their success in this class has been evaluated on more than just attendance. Each of them has been required to do a ministry project. I did not tell them what to do because I wanted this project to get them to understand the most important part of church members. That is the relationship between what skills and interest an individual person has and what the needs of their individual church are. I wanted them to discern their skills and how they can use those skills to address a need of this church. All eight of them have done so successfully.

Jenny Barton is taking her passion for children's ministry further than ever before and helping me in leadership during VBS. Kathrine Hunt is using her gift of Christian witness and preaching the Pentecost sermon on Confirmation Sunday. Hunter Kirkbride is using her artistic skills to create bookmarks for our pew Bibles. Ava Morton is using her love of animals to start a food pantry for pets. Mark has a heart for God's people in need and is using that heart to collect necessary personal items for the homeless. Both Ava and Mark's projects can be donated to by placing items in the bins found in the Narthex. Emma Morrison is helping us celebrate our rich past and creating a "Pastor Wall" that will display the pictures of all of the pastors who have served this church. Angelica Scott is helping us increase our social media presence by creating and maintaining a new Instagram page. This page is already up and running, so please search for us on Instagram! Lawrence Scott has put his craftiness to good use and made me an awesome mailbox, and he is also helping me put together a new Junior Youth Group. I am so proud of these eight students who have found how God made them unique and special and then used those things to improve the ministries of this church.

Now, I encourage all of us to do the same. What is it about you that is unique and special, something divinely created in you, and how can you use that to improve the ministries of this church? You can do this no matter how old or young you are and no matter where you live. I can't wait to hear what you come up with! Amen and thank you all!
