Rhea is the 2025 LGMC Hancock Scholarship Award winner to the weeklong lapidary and jewelry making classes that take place near Fossil Oregon in the first week of September. She recently returned from the experience and is eager to share what she learned and has some finished pieces to show and share. She will be giving the program presentation about staying at the retreat site, her impressions and Hancock skills learning at the February 2026 general club meeting.

Rhea has been a club member since 2008. She was born and raised in Bloomington, Indiana. A railroad near her childhood home became an opportunity to go through rocks between the railroad tracks. She found crinoid fossils and geodes. Some limestone with pyrite excited her, as she thought she had for sure found gold.

Now retired, Rhea was a school cook and cafeteria worker for 22 years. She has three children and currently lives with her daughter, son in law and two grandchildren. Her last job was at

Chinook Middle School. Over the years she has lived in a variety of cities in Idaho, Washington State and notably in Salida, Colorado. Here she joined a rock club and went on frequent field trips as the area had an abundant variety of potential rock and mineral finds including, aquamarine, amazonite, topaz, smoky quartz and mining tailings with chrysocolla.

Her rock interests are diverse, but her specialty is obsidian. She is knowledgeable about the many obsidian types and filled 3 display cases at our April show. Rhea can identify many rocks and minerals and enjoys making cabochons and cutting slabs. She has taught cabbing classes and can be counted on to present and interact with the public at the annual show.

Jr. Club Report - 2025

After taking a break in August, the Junior Club took a field trip to Saddle Mountains to collect petrified wood on Labor Day. Here are photos of some of their favorite finds. Another collector we met at the site gave one of the kids a nice polished piece of petrified wood he had found and worked. Our plan is to tumble some of the pieces we collected to send to other Junior Clubs.

Marty Casto shared information at the September meeting about rockhounding sites in Central Oregon. He brought samples of material he collected at various sites and showed photos of the sites. It is always helpful to see what the places look like and learn about the road conditions so we can properly prepare for a visit!

At the October 14 meeting we will elect officers and have our National Fossil Day program, learning about signs of ancient life found at the John Day Fossil Beds National Monument. The lemur-like primate pictured in this year's poster is Ekgmowechashala, ("little cat man" in Sioux) which ate fruits and insects. We'll also check out the fossils found at the Hanford Reach National Monument.

Mineral of the Month reports

"My Gypsum Report" by Cam

How it forms

To start, gypsum is formed by evaporated water with a high mineral content. Gypsum has fibrous and massive crystals which usually form in the monoclinic crystal system. These awesome crystals have a hardness of 2 on the Mohs scale, making them weak enough to scratch them with your fingernail.

Many specimens also have twinned or curved crystals that can be very big depending on where and how they formed.

In the Cave of Crystals, Mexico, huge gypsum crystals can be up to 36 ft. Long and weigh 50 tons! Gypsum may also form in a desert rose variety. It is called this because it looks like a sandy rose! This proves gypsum can be very cool.

Fun facts

First, did you know that gypsum can be used to make drywall? Secondly, gypsum can appear colorless, white, or gray, but its appearance can vary widely due to impurities, which can cause it to be yellow, red, brown, pink, or even blue!

Third, did you know that gypsum can have a vitreous or silky luster? Also it can have perfect breakage, specific gravity of 2.3, and a white streak.

This concludes my mineral of the month report.

Hi, my name is Melody. My rock report is on agates. Agates are found at some beaches and in river beds, and in places where lava activity was. Agates come in basically all colors, like orange, yellow, and white or clear. Some colors are rarer than others. Fun fact: agates have been used by the Greeks for jewelry. Agate is a type of quartz. All agates are translucent. Petrified wood is an agatized wood. Agates can be dyed different colors like pink or purple. All agates have banding or patterns. Thanks for listening to my rock report.

My name is Callan and my report is on tiger iron. It is made of tiger's eye, red jasper, and hematite. It is rare, and 5 to 7 on the Mohs scale. It is found in red, brown, and multicolored, and is from the United States of America.
