












#### CASINO NIGHT

#### **BABYSITTING NIGHT**



and how it is used. He even let the children try everything on! Everyone had a great time. Thank you Ethan!














# Giving Tree & Giving Hearts Collection


## Remembering Joseph Hoehn






#### **Room 8 Learns About Arctic Animals**
