Palm Sunday Year C Luke 19:28-40



"Jesus proceeded on his journey up to Jerusalem. As he drew near to Bethphage and Bethany at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples. He said, "Go into the village opposite you, and as you enter it you will find a colt tethered on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. And if anyone should ask you, 'Why are you untying it?' you will answer, 'The Master has need of it.'" So those who had been sent went off and found everything just as he had told them. ## Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Palm Sunday

Year C

Luke 19:28-40

Happy Palm Sunday! As we enter Holy Week, we begin by recalling Jesus' Triumphant entrance into Jerusalem (Luke 19:28-40). Luke has Jesus offer considerable teaching (two chapters 20-21) about the Kingdom of God. Many people were open to it and received Jesus, but these two chapters tell how many of the Jerusalem authorities resisted and disputed with Jesus over God's Ways. Their refusal to accept Him, reminds me not to presume to judge God's will-His Way. Of course, the Passion of Christ reading that follows today's reading about Jesus' entry into Jerusalem will challenge all of our expectations of God's way – the fact that suffering, pain and even death can be redeemed if we allow God to use it for His greater good. This is the heart of Christianity (not that it is easily embraced by Christians). It creates the energy driving forgiveness. We may call it the rule of the cross (Luke 9:23). Foremost about our need to accept suffering patiently, is that Jesus set that pattern by His own experience. In fact, as we follow Him, He accompanies us. We are not alone. I think Luke tries to emphasize the redeeming result that can come from our acceptance of suffering FOR others by his recording of the Passion of Christ. Luke uniquely emphasizes the compassion of Christ for us, behind Jesus' desire to readily offer forgiveness to others. We read Luke's version of the Passion today. On Good Friday we will read John's. It is a long reading, but one way to move through it is to use one detail and follow that one detail all through the story, or to watch for what detail strikes you significant early on in the story and pray for its meaning that speaks uniquely to you.

Again, I would like to point out multiple scripture references or experiences in Luke's passion account that demonstrate the compassion of Christ for us. We see in them Jesus' quick desire to heal, forgive and bring peace to otherwise chaotic or cruel circumstances. Notice the numerous places where Jesus heals and forgives others. First, Jesus institutes the Holy Eucharist as a saving memorial (comfort meal) of His love for us (Luke 22:14-20). Secondly, He predicts Peter's denial with the comforting assurance to Peter of Jesus' 'antecedent forgiveness' and that Peter will recover and be stronger afterward "(Luke 22:32 "I have prayed that your own faith may not fail; and once you have turned back, you must strengthen your brothers.") Thirdly, at His arrest, Jesus takes the time to heal the 'high priest's servant's ear that had been cut off in a skirmish with His apostles (Luke 22:51). Fourthly, in Jesus' trial hearing before both Pilate and Herod (and their working back and forth), Jesus ironically established a 'peace-truce' between the two of them ('they became friends who had previously been enemies'-Luke 23:12). Fifthly, Jesus, in effect, takes Barabbas place in punishment, securing Barabbas' amnesty release, setting him free from prison (Luke 23:25) Sixthly, Jesus stops and takes time to offer comforting words to the grieving women along the way to the Cross (Luke 23:28-31). Seventhly, Jesus offers everyone (saving act of redeeming all of us!) a pre-emptive pardon of our sins, asking the Father, "Forgive them, for they do not know what they do" (Luke 23:34). And finally, Jesus' nearly final words were spoken to the repentant thief beside Him on the cross, offering him the forgiving consolation of eternal life with Him ('You will be with me this day in Paradise'-Luke 23:40-43).

So, we see all throughout Jesus' experience of suffering and death, His concern for His sheep. He repeatedly, even in His pain and trials, reaches out to us, seeking to draw us in, and call us to repentance and acceptance of Him. He had mentioned several times that He was praying for us throughout his passion (Luke 22:32, 40 & 46). This would be similar to the actual words of His Prayer found over in the Fourth Gospel (John 17:9 "I pray for them....." & 11 "that you keep them in your Name....." & 15 "keep them from the Evil One...." etc). All for us, to the end, Jesus loved, brought peace and forgave. John 13:1 tells us this on other words, "Jesus loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end". What a compassionate Savior we have, who to his last breath, has the foremost desire to save, heal and bring new life to others. May we take to heart God's love for us, and be more closely drawn to Him through this Holy Week!
