

A simple, pedimented gable, supported by sawn brackets shelters the entrance. Windows consist of 2/2, double-hung throughout the house, a single sash window in the upper hallway, and a paired group of 3/4 size double sash windows in the second floor gable; all are built in plain frames. History and Significance This house once stood on the south side of Bookerman Road near the Huntington/Coleman house (ERI-1545), and was moved to this site for Sam Myers c. 1943. The historic origin is uncertain. In the early 1900's it was owned by the KIL&T. Co and used to house its workers of the west side quarry facilities (ER-337). Frank Reinheimer operated a company general store further west on this same road, and after that building burned on Christmas

- \* Day, 1919, he used the building as his temporary store, carrying a limited line of dry goods and staples. He then took over the management of the "General Store" (ERI-1559) on Division St. from William Burger. Lewis Riedy and the Washko family are also said to have lived here before it was moved. Oral tradition suggests that there was another house on this site, and that it was occupied in the early 1900's by Wilson and Sarah Dean Hamilton. Census Records of 1900 and 1910 seem to bear this out. This house either burned or was razed. It is possible, as so often occurred, that Mr. Meyers used this site or foundation when he moved the house to the property on which he had built his auto service station.
