City Council has adopted a policy providing guidelines to allow for public comment during Council meetings. Citizens are given the opportunity to give public comment at Regular Council meetings, and Called Council meetings. Comments are limited to five (5) minutes. Because of provisions of the Open Meetings Act, members of the Council are not allowed to respond or take part in any discussion related to the comments made.

Texas Law Requires the following:

- ~A Council must allow every person who wishes to address the board on an agenda item to do so during or before the board's consideration of the item.
- ~ A council must allow public comment before or during the board's consideration of agenda items at all open meetings as defined by the OMA;
- ~A Council may establish reasonable rules for public comments including rules that limit the total time a member of the public can address the Council on a given item
- ~ A council may not prohibit public criticism of the board, including criticism of any act, omission, policy, procedures, program, or service; and
- ~ If a council adopts rules limiting the amount of time a member of the public may have to address the board, but does not use simultaneous translation equipment in a manner that allows the board to hear the translated public testimony simultaneously, then the board must provide at least twice the amount of time for non-English speakers who need a translator.

He would like to review that and potentially change the threshold to 50% to initiate water restrictions. Ms. Adams said that the plan had been thoroughly researched using water data, usage, and loss and they had recommended that level and it will be reviewed and renewed in 2029. She suggested that she could discuss the issue with the engineers and express the concerns of the Council so that they could be taken into consideration.

No action was taken on this item.

G. Consider and Discuss a Site Lease Agreement and Right of Way Agreement with Vero Fiber Networks, LLC.—Pat Chesser (Executive Session: 551.071-Consultation with Attorney & 551.072-Deliberation Regarding Real Property)

The Council retired into Executive Session under Section 551.071 & 551.072 at 6:37 p.m.

H. Consider and Discuss Property Owned by the City at Lake Cisco and Lake Lot Leases.—Pat Chesser (Executive Session: 551.071-Consultation with Attorney & 551.072-Deliberation Regarding Real Property)

The Council continued in Executive Session.

I. Reconvene into Open Session and Take Any Action Deemed Necessary as a Result of the Executive Sessions.

The Council reconvened into Regular Session at 7:59 p.m. and Mr. Chesser made presentation saying that from now on, all Lake Lot Lease assignments will be reviewed and approved by the City Council. He further explained that a resolution may be presented at a future meeting to allow for sale of the lake lots to the current lessees for fair market value.

Mr. Tony Held commented that he knew the City of Abilene had made a similar plan and it had taken ten years to begin selling their lots.

Ms. Misty Bussell asked if the assignments could be approved at the next meeting or would further action be required by the Council for that. Mr. Chesser answered that he feels that could begin to move forward immediately as a new procedure.

Mr. Michael Cofferen thanked the Council for their consideration of selling the lots, and asked about the lessees that could not currently afford to purchase their lot. Mr. Chesser answered that current leases would be honored, but the city would like to move out of the lease business. However, he noted again, that the Council has not made any final decisions yet regarding the sale of the lots.

Ms. Melany Weatherly asked about who would appraise the lots and Mr. Chesser answered that local appraisers would be preferred, but he could not provide any other details until further decisions were finalized.

Mr. Mark Knippers asked about the money he paid for his lease and if that would be applied to the purchase of the lot. Ms. Adams commented that individual lease questions would be better answered individually after the Council meeting.

Mr. Jack Douglas said that he had lost sales on his property because of the delays in assignments so he wanted to know if he could get his assignment done now. Mr. Chesser answered affirmatively, if the lessee would provide all the information to the city, then they could be placed on an agenda to be consented to by the City Council.

Mr. Don Hare questioned why the process was changing and Mr. Chesser explained that this would just be a new procedure for procuring consent from the city for approval of assignments.

Motion was made by Councilmember Boles to direct the City Attorney and the City Manager to draft a resolution concerning lake lot leases, second was made by Councilmember Rogers-Bennett.

Before voting, Councilmember Johnson requested clarification about the resolution and whether or not it will affect the leases needing to be assigned, asking if the assignment of leases will be dependent on the passage of the resolution. Mr. Chesser answered that the new procedure for assignments of lease will not be affected by the proposal of a resolution.

The Council returned to the motion and second. Motion prevailed by the following vote:

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to operate a central dispatching facility, hereinafter called EASTLAND COUNTY COOPERATIVE DISPATCH, by the County of Eastland and for the County of Eastland, the Cities of Cisco, Eastland, Ranger, Gorman, Rising Star, the Eastland Memorial Hospital District and Cisco College in order to provide emergency response communications throughout the area served by the dispatching facility.

2. SCOPE

This agreement hereby gives responsibility of operations of EASTLAND COUNTY COOPERATIVE DISPATCH to the County of Eastland.

3. DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS

- (a) This agreement acknowledges that the County of Eastland will have full authority and responsibility for the operation of Eastland County Cooperative Dispatch.
- (b) The Eastland County Cooperative Dispatch, as a separate department of the County of Eastland, will be subject to the budgetary and audit controls of the Eastland County Commissioners' Court.
- (c) An additional two percent of total operating expenditures for the fiscal year will be included in the annual support to allow for unplanned emergency expenditures.
- (d) The percentage paid by each governmental entity is based upon 2010 Census population and is subject to change in proportion with changes in the census.

(e) The participating entities will be assessed an annual fee in the following manner:

Support for governmental entities will be the dollar amount resulting from the calculated population percentages shown below times operating budget plus allowable two percent less total annual support from Eastland Memorial Hospital and Cisco College:

One-twelfth (1/12) of annual payment is due at the beginning of each month beginning October 1, 2024. The County of Eastland will mail annual support statements to each of the participating entities in September 2024.

- (f) Any entity that defaults on payment of the monthly assessment shall forfeit all rights to the usage of Eastland County Cooperative Dispatch until said assessments are paid in full.
- (g) The County of Eastland will provide to each participating entity a proposed budget for the upcoming fiscal year no later than July 1st of each year.

4. GENERAL USAGE

- (a) The County of Eastland may add members to the Cooperative.
- (b) Services shall be prioritized with primary emphasis on public safety.
- (c) Eastland County Cooperative Dispatch will be the primary Public Service Answering Point (PSAP) for 9-1-1 and Eastland Police Department will be the secondary PSAP for 9-1-1.
- (d) Eastland County Cooperative Dispatch will provide communications services to the Texas Department of Public Safety and other non-contributing law enforcement agencies as necessary.

5. EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION OF AGREEMENT

- (a) The effective date of this Agreement shall be October 1, 2025.
- (b) This agreement shall be for one year.

THIS CONTRACT AND AGREEMENT made and entered into this the 1 st of October 2025, by and of Eastland, through between the County and its by Commissioner's Court, (hereinafter called "County"), the City Municipal Corporation, by and through Eastland. Commissioners, and the City of Cisco, a Municipal Corporation, by and through its City Commissioners (both hereinafter called "Cities"), and Eastland Memorial Hospital District d/b/a Eastland Memorial Hospital, by and through its Board of Directors, (hereinafter called "Hospital").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire cooperatively to provide basic Emergency Medical Service (EMS) to persons within the City of Eastland, City of Cisco, Precinct One and Precinct Three and Four of Eastland County and Eastland Memorial Hospital District; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto believe that it is to their constituent's best interests and mutual benefit to enter into this Cooperative Ambulance Service Contract for the provision of Emergency Medical Services to their respective areas; and

WHEREAS, Hospital agrees to provide basic Emergency Medical Services to persons within the City of Eastland, City of Cisco, Precinct One and Precinct Three and Four of Eastland County and Eastland Memorial Hospital District as hereinafter set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the terms, provisions and mutual promises herein contained, it is mutually agreed as follows:

- 1. The Hospital agrees to provide Emergency Medical Service for the constituents of the aforesaid parties and agrees to operate Emergency Medical Service vehicles in a reasonable and prudent manner.
- 2. The Hospital agrees to abide by all state, federal and municipal laws and ordinances governing the operation of Emergency Medical Services and of personnel employed to perform such services.
- 3. The Hospital agrees to furnish to County and Cities, as a part of the ordinary business expense of the Emergency Medical Service, a current certificate of insurance issued and executed by an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of Texas, certifying that the Hospital has in full force and effect a policy of comprehensive general liability insurance with combined single limits of liability of not less than \$100,000.00/\$300,000.00. Further, Hospital agrees to provide, as a part of the ordinary business expense of the Emergency Medical Service collision and extended coverage insurance upon the ambulances and automobile liability with combined single limits of at least \$1,000,000.00, with the Cities and County named as additional insureds.
- 4. The parties hereto agree that the Hospital shall be entitled to retain all gross receipts (revenues) from the operation of the Emergency Medical Service. Further, the parties agree that the Hospital shall pay any and all related expenses incurred in the operation of said Emergency Medical Services out of the revenue collected from said operations. Further, the Cities and County shall pay an annual subsidy to the Hospital, upon execution of this contract, in the following sums:

County of Eastland	\$156,000
City of Eastland	\$114,715
City of Cisco	\$114,715

Said sum or portions thereof, shall be used by Hospital as needed to defray expenses in operating the Emergency Medical Service for each month in which expenses exceed revenues collected. In months where collected revenues exceed expenses, the net revenues will be carried forward and applied to future monthly deficits before any subsidies are applied. At the end of each anniversary of this contract, subsidies that have not been used will be deposited into an EMS Reserve Fund for ambulance, EMS equipment and/or ambulance chassis replacement.

In the event that Hospital expends all of said County and Cities subsidies as above described in the operation of the Emergency Medical Service, and the expenses thereafter exceed revenues for any month, then, in that event, the Hospital shall contribute monthly an amount of money equal to the expenses that exceed revenue until the amount contributed by said Hospital shall equal the sum of \$114,715. In the event that Hospital contributes an amount equal to \$114,715, then, the Cities, County and Hospital shall meet immediately to determine if there are any additional funds available to continue the Emergency Medical Service operation or in the alternative, if the Emergency terminated. Medical Service should be This meeting shall attended by the designated representatives of each party as soon as is reasonably possible after the Hospital has contributed a sum up to the amount of \$114,715.

If a determination is made that there are no additional funds available to continue the operation of the Emergency Medical Service and/or the parties (one or all) decide not to contribute additional subsidies, then, in that event, this contract shall terminate and be at an end for all parties.

6. The County, Cities and Hospital shall share equally in the cost of replacing ambulance vehicles if monies in the EMS Reserve Fund are not adequate to cover the cost of replacement ambulance vehicles. The Hospital

will set equipment replacement criteria that are fair, reasonable and provides for optimal safety of patients and EMS technicians.

- 7. The parties hereto agree that the Hospital shall furnish to the Cities and County monthly statements of operation accompanied by a written report showing the total revenues collected and the cost of operation during the preceding month for Emergency Medical Services.
- 8. The term of this contract shall be for one (1) year beginning October 1, 2025 and ending on September 30, 2026. This agreement may be altered or modified at any time by the written agreement of all parties hereto.

On or before August 1, preceding each contract year, the Hospital shall provide to the Cities and County a financial budget of the EMS operation for the upcoming contract year, any anticipated changes to the financial operation of the EMS which impact the County, Cities or Hospital's participation in the EMS service, and any notice regarding the Hospital's intent to continue or discontinue the provision of EMS Services.

All parties hereto agree and understand that said budget is at best an estimate of both income and expenses for said fiscal year; that actual income and expense figures may vary from said budget and that all parties understand and agree that the actual financial obligation to be assumed by all parties may vary from said budget.

- 9. The rates and charges for Emergency Medical Services provided herein shall be established based upon reasonable and customary charges for like services in the region.
- 10. It is understood and agreed by and between all parties hereto that should the area of coverage of the Hospital's Emergency Medical Services change, all parties shall immediately meet in a good faith effort to renegotiate this contract.

- 11. In an effort to streamline operations of the Emergency Medical Service, as herein described, the Cities, County and Hospital agree to designate no more than one (1) representative each, to participate on an Emergency Medical Service steering committee which said committee shall meet as needed to make recommendations to the Hospital on the overall direction and operation of said Emergency Medical Services.
- 12. This contract shall be construed under the laws of the State of Texas and is performable in Eastland County, Texas.
- 13. This contract may not be assigned by any party hereto without prior written consent of all other parties.

Need

Recently there has been a surge in demand for recreational vehicle lot space. This is due to construction in the area of AI Centers as well as Alternative Energy projects. Further, the city has a lack of affordable housing in general. Due to this increased need we are proposing this Limited Use Permit to allow us to use some of the existing lots as 4 Recreational Vehicle Lots.

Implementation

The property already has subdivisions with electrical, water, sewer and parking spaces. As such it will be simple to update these to current codes and for use with Recreational Vehicles.

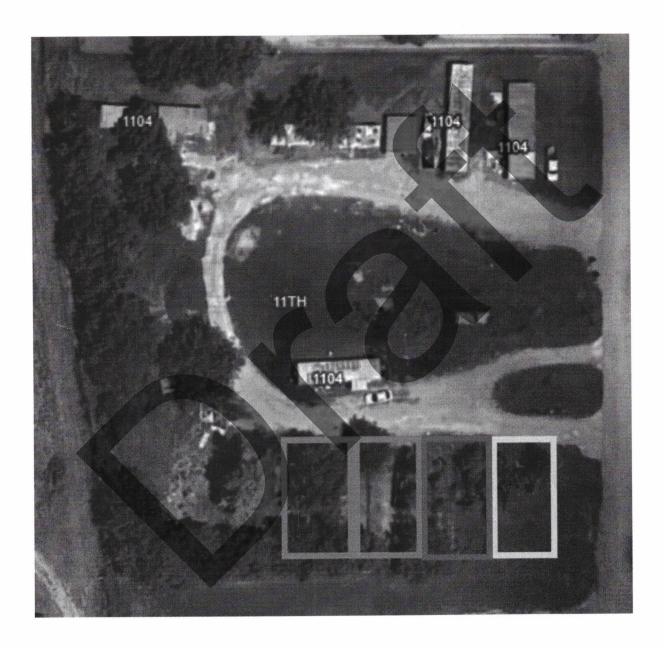
Benefit

This installation will relieve some of the demand for Recreational Vehicle Facilities mentioned previously. Further, this will also accelerate our plans for improving the property. Since we took ownership of the property in March of 2025 we have removed numerous dumpsters full of debris, established routine maintenance of the grounds and rehabilitated one home to habitable condition. Having the additional revenue from these spaces will speed our ability to completely remove all debris from the property and improve the aesthetics of the entire property. Additionally, the added hookups would be accounted for during tax time for additional revenue for the city and county.

Timetable

We believe we could have the first lot ready within one month of permit approval. Each additional lot would be put into service once the previous one had been rented. We anticipate these would be in use for no more than 4 years. By that time we anticipate being ready to further develop the property with more permanent housing.

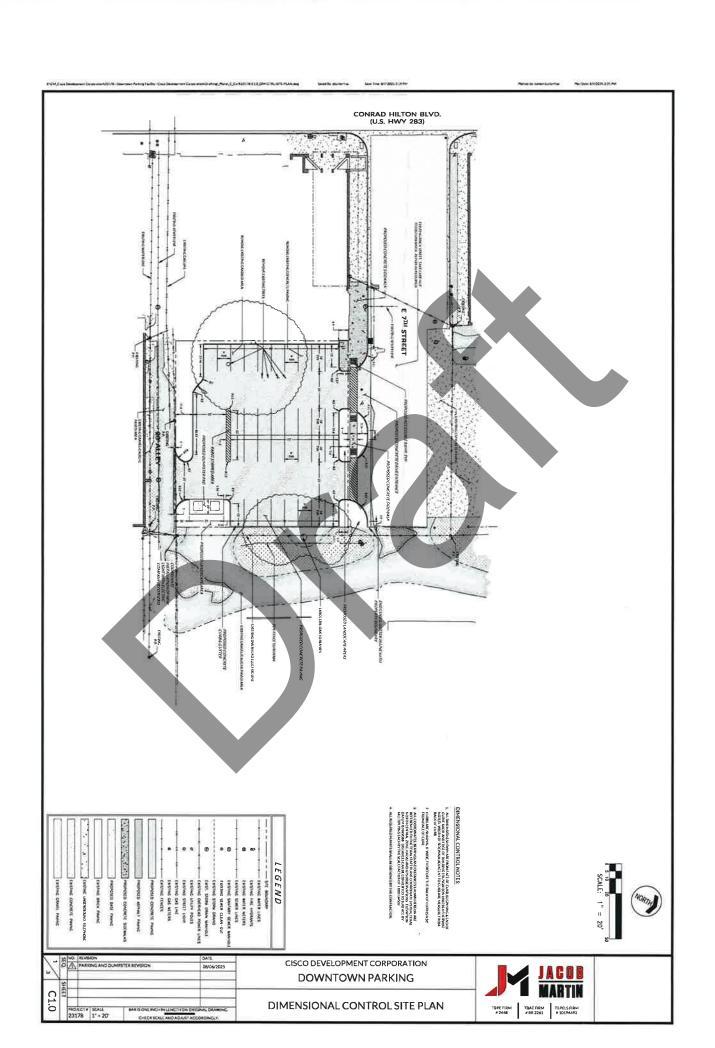

1. GENERAL PURPOSE.

The parties hereto (Lessor and Lessee) recognize and acknowledge that the primary purpose of Lake Cisco is to supply the City of Cisco Texas with water for human consumption.

2. TERM.

The term of this Lease Agreement is for a period commencing on the date of execution hereof and ending on **June 30**, **2070**.

RENTAL.

Lessee agrees to pay Lessor an annual rental under this Lease Agreement the sum of \$300.00 per lot per year, said rental payable in advance, on or before July 1st of each year, at the office of the City of Cisco, Texas, 500 Conrad Hilton Blvd., Cisco, Texas 76437. Lessor reserves the right to increase the rent in 2025; and each successive five (5) year period thereafter, during the term of this Lease Agreement, by an amount that does not exceed \$50.00 of the rate in effect for the preceding 5 year period. The amount of the rate increase shall be set by the Lessor by action of the City Council of the City of Cisco, Texas. Notification shall be given to Lessee at least 30 days prior to the effective date of the rental rate increase. Failure to notify Lessee shall not affect the validity of any rental increase.

4. ADDRESSES.

The address listed below Lessee's signature on this lease agreement shall be used for all notices and/or correspondence required between Lessor and Lessee. The Lessee shall notify the Lessor of any change of address of Lessee. Such changes of addresses shall be maintained in the files of the City of Cisco, Texas office. All notifications hereunder will be presumed to be correct if sent to the Lessee's address as reflected by the records of the City of Cisco, Texas office. Notices to the Lessor shall be to the City of Cisco, Texas, Attn: City Secretary, unless otherwise designated by Lessor on a form provided by the City of Cisco, Texas office and receipt thereof acknowledged by the Lessee.

5. NOTIFICATION.

Lessor shall not be required to send Lessee notice of the annual rental payments due under this lease except for the rental increases as noted above. If Lessee fails to timely pay rental under this lease, a late notice will be sent by the City of Cisco, Texas by certified mail to the last address of Lessee on file with the City of Cisco, Texas. The Lessee will have until September 1st to pay the delinquency, along with a late fee of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) or as amended by Lessor. If the payment of the delinquency and late fee are not received by the City of Cisco, Texas office on or before September 1st, this lease shall be deemed terminated without further action by Lessor.

6. NO COMMERCIAL USE.

Lessee shall not use the Premises nor any part thereof for commercial purposes, but only for residential purposes.

7. CONSTRUCTION.

Buildings, structures, and facilities, installed or constructed on Premises, shall be of sound and substantial construction and be done in accordance with plans and specifications approved by Lessor and shall be situated above the 1523 foot contour elevation. Plans for buildings, structures, and facilities shall meet the minimum standards provided for similar construction within the City of Cisco, Texas, and shall be approved by the Building Inspection Department of the City of Cisco, Texas prior to the construction or installation. Such plans and specifications shall be furnished by Lessee at Lessee's expense. All construction and improvements made to Premises shall comply with all applicable City, State, and Federal building, health, and sanitation rules and regulations. Lessee shall construct no building, structure, or facility without first obtaining a proper permit for such work from the applicable department of the City of Cisco, Texas. All buildings, structures, and facilities shall be constructed substantially in accordance with the plans and specifications previously approved by Lessor in good and workmanlike manner, and Lessee shall keep same maintained in good repair and appearance. During the term of this lease, the Lessee agrees to correct any substandard or otherwise undesirable conditions resulting from failure to properly maintain structures, grounds, or facilities. If on the date of this lease, there are

buildings, structures, and/or facilities located on Premises, the Lessor shall have the Building Inspection Department and such other departments as are appropriate, inspect the property to determine if such buildings, structures, and facilities meet the minimum standards set by the City of Cisco, Texas. If such inspection reveals failure to meet such minimum standards, then a report shall be given to Lessee of the needed repairs to meet such standards. Lessee shall have 6 months after receipt of such inspection report to bring Premises up to the minimum standards set forth in the inspection report, provided that for good cause the City Council of the City of Cisco, Texas or its designated representative may extend such time period an additional 6 months. Lessee shall pay the appropriate City fees for all permits and inspections save and except the initial inspection provided for above. Failure to comply with these requirements shall be cause for termination of this lease. All improvements placed upon the Premises by Lessee shall be at Lessee's own risk, peril, and Lessor shall never be liable for any damages or destruction of any such improvements occasioned by the rising and/or lowering of the water in Lake Cisco.

8. MAINTENANCE.

- A. Lessee shall keep Premises clean of trash, rubbish, garbage, and waste matter of all kinds and will provide such facilities for the disposal of this matter as Lessor shall require.
- B.. Lessee further agrees to maintain the shoreline, immediately adjacent land and water free of garbage, trash, or other waste. Lessee shall not discharge, nor allow to be discharged any waste of any kind into the waters of Lake Cisco, and agrees to abide by all rules, regulations, or other laws related to the maintenance of water quality in Lake Cisco as established by Lessor and other local, State, and Federal agencies with jurisdiction over same. Lessee shall indemnify Lessor for any cost associated with the clean-up of any pollution caused by Lessee's use of Premises.
- C. Lessee acknowledges that Lessor shall have no obligation to furnish any solid waste collection or disposal system.
- **D**. Lessee shall keep the weeds on Premises mowed to a height not exceeding ten (10) inches, and shall not allow or maintain on Premises any dangerous or dilapidated buildings, structures, or facilities as determined by Lessor in applying the applicable City of Cisco, Texas and State rules and regulations.
- **E.** Lessee will not burn refuse, garbage, trash, rubbish and waste on Premises as a means of disposal, except that brush, limbs, branches and vegetation waste may be burned on Premises as approved by county and state authority after Lessee has obtained a Burn Permit from the City of Cisco in accordance with Section 8-45 of the City's Code of Ordinances.
- **F.** Lessor shall notify Lessee in writing of Lessee's failure to comply with any of the above provisions as to maintenance of Premises. Lessee shall have 10 days in which to correct the situation set forth in the notice from Lessor (or longer period set by Lessor if such default is of a nature that it cannot be corrected within such

period) and if Lessee fails to make necessary corrective action within said time period, then Lessor may make such corrections. Lessor shall be entitled to recover its costs of labor, materials, equipment, and administration in correcting such situation and payment shall be made within 30 days of receipt of statement of such cost by Lessee. Lessee shall pay for any and all inspections after the initial inspection by Lessor at the rates provided for by the appropriate department of Lessor. In the alternative, Lessor may terminate this lease or choose other remedies available herein or by law.

9. SEWAGE DISPOSAL.

Lessee shall be required to adhere to all City, State, and Federal environmental rules and regulations as to the sanitary disposal of sewage. No outside toilets shall be permitted on the Premises.

10. ASSIGNMENT.

Lessee may sub-lease or sell its right, title and interest in and to the above described Premises under this Lease Agreement only upon the written consent of Lessor.

11. ROADS AND RIGHT-OF-WAYS.

Lessee may utilize at its own risk the road known as North Shore Drive and the Highway known as FM Road 2807 to access the Premises. Lessor is not obligated to maintain the road known as North Shore Drive.

12. TAXES.

Lessee agrees to pay and discharge all taxes and assessments which now or hereafter may be taxed, assessed, levied, or imposed upon Premises, any leasehold interests, or any improvements placed thereon.

13. MISCELLANEOUS RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Lessee agrees to obey the following rules and regulations:

- A. Lessee shall not use Premises at any time in any manner or for any purpose in conflict with or contrary to the penal statutes of the State or Federal government.
- **B.** Lessee shall not make any use of Premises which would constitute a nuisance.
- **C**. Lessee is under the absolute obligation to use the Premises in a manner that shall prevent the pollution of the waters of Lake Cisco in any manner.
- **D**. Upon discovery, the City may remove any unpermitted items, structures or improvements, including but not limited to fences, picnic shelters, storage buildings, piers, docks, boat houses, and crappie houses, which are found to be placed on any other property not on Premises.

E. Lessee agrees that this Lease is made subject to such restrictions, rules, and regulations that may be established from time to time by the City of Cisco to secure, maintain, and preserve the sanitary and safe conditions of Lake Cisco.

14. USE OF WATER.

Lessee may use water drawn directly from Lake Cisco for residential purposes only, and such use of water drawn directly from Lake Cisco shall be solely for the structures located on the Premises.

15. HUNTING.

Lessee shall not hunt nor allow hunting on the Premises.

16. BREACH OF COVENANTS.

If Lessee breaches any express or implied covenant of this lease, the Lessor shall have the right to terminate this lease, giving the appropriate notices to Lessee as provided for herein. After the appropriate notices as provided for herein and the time periods have expired for late payment, or the time to cure breaches set forth by Lessor, has expired, then Lessor shall proceed to dispose of Lessee's interest in the Premises in the following manner:

Lessee shall have 60 days from the date of termination of the lease by Lessor in which to dispose of Lessee's leasehold rights by assignment or conveyance to person or persons acceptable to Lessor and provided that said person or persons shall satisfy the obligations of Lessee as set forth in the notice of termination. Or the Lessee may, at Lessee's election upon receipt of notice of termination, within sixty (60) days of the date of said notice, remove all improvements placed on the Premises by Lessee, but in removing such improvements the Lessee will not damage to any extent any of the property belonging to Lessor or any other person. If Lessor has not made an assignment or conveyance, or elected to remove Lessee's improvements as provided for above within the time period provided, then Lessor shall have the right to enter upon the Premises and take possession thereof or at Lessor's option, sell to the highest bidder at either public or private sale, all of Lessee's interest in this lease and the improvements placed thereon. The receipts from the sale shall be applied first to the expense of holding the sale; second to any Deed of Trust or Mechanic's Lien outstanding against any buildings or improvements placed on the improvements; third to any indebtedness owed by Lessee to Lessor; and the remainder, if any, shall be paid to Lessee and shall be received by Lessee as full payment of all rights, title and interest of Lessee in and to the leased premises and improvements thereon. Provided, however, that the time periods provided for above shall not prevent Lessor's right to immediate action to abate any nuisance on the Premises.

17. LIABILITY FOR TERMINATION.

In no event shall Lessor, its agents, servants, or employees be liable for any damages, breach of contract, or any action in the nature of trespass of any kind or character for terminating this lease as provided for herein.

18. INDEMNITY.

Lessee represents and agrees that Lessee has thoroughly inspected the Premises covered by this lease prior to execution of the Lease Agreement, and has found no hazardous conditions which may cause injury to persons or damage to the property, and Lessee accepts the Premises in such condition. Lessor makes no warranties, express or implied, concerning the condition of the Premises. Lessee also agrees that Lessor shall not be liable in any manner for bodily injury or death to any person or damage to any property (including the person and property of Lessee) caused in whole or in part by any latent or patent condition or defect on the leased premises or as a result of flooding or high water or as a result of any act or omission of Lessee or Lessee's family members, quests, or licensees, and LESSEE SPECIFICALLY AGREES TO INDEMNIFY AND HOLD LESSOR HARMLESS FROM ANY SUCH CLAIMS, DEMANDS, OR SUITS FOR INJURIES OR DEATH TO PERSONS OR DAMAGE TO PROPERTY, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER SUCH INJURY, DEATH, OR DAMAGE WAS CAUSED OF CONTRIBUTED TO IN PART BY SOME ACT OR OMISSION BY THE LESSOR, ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS, OR EMPLOYEES.

19. MINERAL INTEREST.

This Lease Agreement is made subject to the right of the owners of the oil, gas and other minerals to explore for, develop, produce, and market the oil, gas and other minerals, thereunder.

20. LESSOR'S LIEN.

If Lessee should be indebted to Lessor for rent or otherwise, Lessor will have the lien secure the payment of said indebtedness on all of the buildings, improvements chattels and other personal property placed on the Premises by Lessee.

21. RIGHT OF ENTRY.

Lessor, its agents, employees, or representatives may enter the Premises at any reasonable time for the purpose of inspection to determine that the conditions or provisions of this lease are being fulfilled.

22. APPLICABLE LAW AND VENUE.

This Lease Agreement and all transactions made hereunder shall be construed and governed according to the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any legal proceedings shall be in Eastland County, Texas.

23. ATTORNEY'S FEES.

If any action at law or in equity is necessary to enforce this lease agreement, each party agrees to pay its own attorney fees and will not seek to recover its attorneys' fees and costs of court from the other party. Lessee expressly waives its statutory rights to recovery of attorneys' fees as outlined in Texas Local Govt. Code §271.153(a)(3) and Chapter 92 of the Texas Property Code, including but not limited to §92.005.

24. INVALID PROVISIONS.

In the event any covenant, condition, or provision herein contained is held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the validity of any such covenant, condition, or provision shall in no way affect any other covenant, condition, or provision.

25. ENTIRE AGREEMENT.

This written contract constitutes the entire Lease Agreement between the parties.
