This Intermediate Fire Behavior Course S-290 is hosted by Good Oak Ecological Services and Incident Management Specialist LLC as an opportunity to educate people on how to use fire behavior knowledge to safely suppress wildfires and manage prescribed fires.

This course is National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) certified. The online course work can be completed in approximately fifteen hours (current average), but may vary depending on level of student knowledge.

The online portion of this course consists of a pre-course test and twelve online modules with a test for each that the student must successfully complete before attending the classroom portion and becoming eligible to receive a certificate.

After the student has completed the online portion of the course a one-day session will be conducted with the students in a classroom environment to discuss questions that they have and to discuss the areas of fuels, weather and topography and how they determine what the fire behavior will be on a specific site in Wisconsin.

This S-290 course is the second course in five course sequence developing wildland fire behavior prediction knowledge and skills. It builds upon the basics in S-190, Introduction to Wildland Fire Behavior, but with more detailed information about characteristics and interactions of the wildland fire environment (fuels, weather, and topography) that affect wildland fire behavior for safety purposes.

The Objectives for this course are:

- Identify and describe the characteristics of fuels, weather, and topography that influence wildland fire behavior.
- Describe the interaction of fuels, weather, and topography on wildland fire behavior, fireline tactics, and safety.
- Describe the causes of extreme wildland fire behavior (long-range spotting, crowning, and fire whirls) developing due to fuels, weather, and/or topography.
- Interpret, apply, and document wildland fire behavior and weather information.

Target Group:

Personnel desiring to be qualified as any single resource boss or fire effects monitor (FEMO). Upon successful completion of this course, students will earn a NWCG certificate which may be necessary to work on wildfires or to participate in prescribed fires sponsored by some agencies.

Course Prerequisites:

The student must have completed Introduction to Wildland Fire Behavior (S-190).

Completing Pre-course work:

The pre-course work is designed to ensure that students come to class with a basic understanding of the fire environment in order to learn Intermediate Fire Behavior concepts. The pre-course work is divided into seven parts that correspond to questions on the pre-qualifying test. You will need to complete the pre-qualifying test using the information that will be provided online. You must receive a passing score of 70% or higher to be considered for admittance to the course.

You must register for this course by March 16,2018, to be eligible to attend the classroom portion and receive a certificate for this course.

Instructor: This course will be taught by Incident Management Specialist LLC, instructor Ken Terrill from Sun Prairie, WI, who is certified by the National Wildfire Suppression Association (NWSA) to deliver this course and is approved by the National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG), which is the national organization that has developed the training and qualification standards for wildfire and prescribe fire professionals. Ken has over 25 years of experience in working wildfire and prescribe fire for the State of Wisconsin, South Dakota and nationally.

Date and time for classroom day: Classroom Day will be held March 23, 2018 starting at 9:00 am., and ending at 5:00 p.m. A minimum of 15 students will need to register and complete the on-line portion of the course for the classroom to be portion to be conducted. If the course is cancelled due to low enrollment \$250 of the registration fee will be returned to the student.

What to bring to classroom day: Bring the work you completed online, which includes the pre-course test and the twelve course module documents showing that you completed each of them. Students must attend all class hours to obtain certification. Students must bring a copy of their certificates showing that they have completed the prerequisite course Introduction to Fire Behavior S-190 and the twelve modules for the course.
