We have NO PAID staff so all proceeds from everything that we do go directly to the Shriners Children's Florida.





- Who We Are: Shriners Children's Florida is a nonprofit specialty outpatient care facility founded by Shriners International in 1985
- Where We Are: located on the University of South Florida's main campus, off Fowler Avenue 12502 USF Pine Drive, Tampa, Fla.
- Partnerships: Tampa General Hospital & University of Florida/UF Health
- Total number of patients served since opening: More than 65,000 patients
- Service coverage areas: All of Florida and South Georgia
- **Some Conditions We Treat**: Scoliosis, hip and leg deformities, hand and arm deformities, sports injuries, concussions, fractures, osteogenesis imperfecta (brittlebone disease), cerebral palsy, clubfoot
- **Services we provide**: MDA Care Center (for patients with muscular dystrophy), endocrine clinic, wheelchairs, braces, prosthetic limbs, physical, occupational and speech therapies. (All services are provided regardless of the families' ability to pay.)
- 2020 at a glance
 - 321 children had outpatient surgeries (at TGH, by our surgeons)
 - 8,756 visits were made to our outpatient clinic
- 760 visits were made to our seating department
- 7,737 visits were made to our radiology department


