Walking With God

Walking in God's Word

Key Scripture: *"But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God"* (Matthew 4:4).

Key Thought: Walking in the Word is a joyful journey.

Prayer: Lord God, your Word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path. ¹ When I go, your Word will lead me. When I sleep, your Word will keep me. When I awaken, your Word will talk with me. ² Your Word is truly a lamp and a light for me. ³

Thank you for your Word which imparts faith to my heart. ⁴ As I believe your word, you fill me with all joy and peace, and I abound in hope through the power of the Holy Spirit. ⁵

Therefore, I will not let your Word depart from my mouth as I meditate upon its truths day and night. I will walk in your Word daily, and I know you will fulfill your promise to make my way prosperous, and to fill my life with good success. ⁶

Dear God, your wonderful Word gives me life ⁷ because it is the Word of life. It reminds me that death and life are in the power of my tongue, ⁸ and that when I speak your Word, I speak forth life into my own heart and the hearts of others. As I continue to hold forth your word, Lord, help me to rejoice as in the day of Christ, knowing that my labor is never in vain in you, Father. ⁹ Help me to always be a doer of your Word, not only a hearer. ¹⁰ By keeping your Word, I realize that your love is made perfect in me. Give me your grace, Lord, to be both a doer and a keeper of your Word. ¹¹

Lord God, your way is perfect, and your Word is tried. You are my mighty buckler, and I put all my trust in you. ¹² I know your Word will never return to you without it having its desired effect. ¹³ Thank you for your Word, Father, and help me keep on walking in your Word.

Heavenly Father, I want to live by every word that comes from your mouth. ¹⁴ Your Word is wonderful to me; it is quick, powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword. ¹⁵ I will walk in the light of your Word every day of my life.

The fruit of the Spirit abides in us and it is up to us to cultivate it so that we may experience the blessing and the fullness of the Spirit. God is the husbandman..."He prunes, nurtures, waters and protects His own. The indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit will energize and control every faculty of our nature when our will joins the will of God. Then the "beauty of the Lord will be upon us" (Psalm 90:17) and "we shall bring forth fruit unto God" (Romans 7:4)."

FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT: LONG-SUFFERING (PATIENCE)

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, LONG-SUFFERING, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance." (Galatians 5:22,23)

LONG-SUFFERING is from the Greek word "makrothumia" which speaks of steadfastness of the soul under provocation. It means forbearance and patient endurance of any ill-treatment, without anger or thought of revenge. LONG-SUFFERING, or PATIENCE ("Hupomone") is the God-given ability of a Christian to remain upright in spite of overwhelming circumstances, tests and tribulations. It is a sweet attitude toward any trial that God permits in the life of the Christian. It is what enables the Christian to "give thanks in everything".

LONG-SUFFERING is a product of faith. We must believe that God is at work in our lives and that we will not be forgotten by the God to whom we have committed the keeping of our souls. LONG-SUFFERING grows where there is a continual awareness of God. God is faithful and will not allow evil to overcome us, but our trust must be anchored only in Him. It is inward peace, as well as outward control. How is LONG-SUFFERING produced? TROUBLE!! Trouble alone will make us impatient, but trouble connected with faith produces LONG-SUFFERING.

LONG-SUFFERING is also produced by knowledge, faith and hope. When we understand what is going on we can patiently await the outcome. LONG-SUFFERING does not stand alone, it supports and is supported by the other fruit of the Spirit, for without love, faith, hope, kindness, etc., one cannot be patient. God's timing does not always coincide with our immediate plans, but LONG-SUFFERING offers opportunity for spiritual growth while waiting for God to intervene on our behalf. How do we recognize LONG-SUFFERING? Look for persons who: • - have forgiving spirits. are enduring hardships, illness, or loss patiently • - are obedient to God, even under great persecution • - have control over their tempers and attitudes • - despite great difficulty remain Christ like • continue to praise and thank God in all things, whether good or bad • face tribulations head on and do not try to escape the trial or take matters into their own hands. • WARNING Avoid the enemy of LONG-SUFFERING - impatience, which if allowed to take root leads to disobedience. Impatience is a direct stance against God.

Additional Scriptures: For a perfect example of LONG-SUFFERING, read the Gospels - Matthew, Mark, Luke and John to see how Jesus exhibited LONG-SUFFERING.; Colossians 1:11, Colossians 3:13, Luke 8:15, Luke 21:19, I Timothy 6:11, 12, The Book of Job, I Peter 2:19,20, Hebrews 6:10-15, 1 Peter 3:17, James 5.

THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT: TEMPERANCE.

TEMPERANCE: Possessing power, strong, having mastery or possession of; self-control. TEMPERANCE controls when self is out of control. Steady, balance. TEMPERANCE enables the saint of God to praise Him in discipline or testing, trials and the battles of life.

In the Book of Nehemiah, the walls of Jerusalem were broken down and "a city, in ancient days, without walls, had lost its sense of identity and all its defenses. It was prey to every kind of enemy, natural, as well as human". (The Fruit of the Spirit; John w. Sanderson). A life that lacks self-control is similar to a city with broken down walls because it lacks defense and every conceivable evil seeks to enter in. An uncontrolled body and an uncontrolled spirit is at risk for destruction and spiritual decay.

How to cultivate the fruit of Temperance (Consider the athlete's self-discipline code): 1. Aim- run to win 2. Follow training rules - deny self of things that will hinder your winning. 3. Constant, sustained effort - have a well-defined goal: an intelligent manner of life and continue pressing toward the goal. 4. Remember, "You are not your own. You are brought with a price" (I Corinthians 6:19,20) 5. Remember to call ever' faculty' into obedience to Christ, to the glory of God. 6. Allow the Holy Spirit's leading in reminding you of who you are, who God is, where you came from, and where you are headed.

How to Recognize Temperance

Look for persons who: * have control over their bodies and do not indulge in harmful activities * have control over their spiritual life. * do not exhibit pride in less than godly goals * are not defenseless, but is fully dressed in the armor of God * is not angry, envious or covetous * shows spiritual growth and maturity * has a passion to be Christ like.

Thank you for joining me to my spouse as one flesh.⁶ Help me to love and respect my spouse at all times.⁷ It is my desire, Father, to serve you. Help me and my spouse to make the conscious choice together to choose to serve you at all times.⁸ Lead us to put you and your righteousness first in our lives and in our marriage.⁹

Thank you, Father, for showing me that my spouse and I are heirs together of your grace of life. Show me how to honor my spouse so that my prayers will never be hindered.¹⁰

Lord, I believe you are at work in my marriage, and I thank you that the troubles of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory you are going to reveal to us.¹¹

Faith is being sure that God will keep His promises. Faith in God protects you when you are tempted to doubt.


The Helmet of Salvation (Eph. 6:17)

The Sword of the Spirit (Eph. 6:17)
which is the Word of God. God's Word is our offensive weapon. When we tell others what the Bible says, the Holy Spirit helps people see their bad thoughts and actions, and makes them want to be forgiven.

Feet Prepared with the Gospel of Peace (Eph. 6:15)

Ephesians 6:10-20 (New King James Version)

10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. 11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. 12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, ^[a] against spiritual *hosts* of wickedness in the heavenly *places*. 13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. 14 Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, 15 and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; 16 above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. 17 And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; 18 praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints— 19 and for me, that utterance may be given to me, that I may open my mouth boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel, 20 for which I am an ambassador in chains; that in it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak.

The Season After Pentecost

The Season After Pentecost is sometimes referred to as Whitsuntide or Trinity season. This period has also been divided by some denominations into The Season After Pentecost and Kingdomtide. When the period is divided, The Season After Pentecost covers 10-14 Sundays, and Kingdomtide covers 13-14 Sundays.

Color: Red is the liturgical color for the Season After Pentecost. Red is symbolic of loyalty, power, witness, Christian zeal, blood, fire, the work and ministry of the church, and the Holy Spirit.

Kingdomtide

Kingdomtide begins on the last Sunday in August and continues until the beginning of Advent. The emphasis includes evangelism, world missions, and the work for peace and justice in all relationships. During this period, special emphasis is placed on the Kingship of the Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The observance is wrapped up in the heightened awareness of one of the basic tenets of the Christian faith – the hope of the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven

Color: Green is symbolic of freshness of nature, hope, life and growth.

Devotional Reading: Genesis 2:18-24

Scripture: Romans 8:1-14

EXALT!

Invocation: Speak Lord so that we hear from heaven. Speak through Your word, our teacher, and to each of us. Center our thoughts on You. During this lesson and in the week to follow, let the Holy Ghost energize our spirits for your purpose. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Celebration: When we walk with the Lord in the light of His word, what a glory He sheds on our way! While we do His good-will, He abides with us still, and with all who will trust and obey. Trust and obey, for there's no other way. To be happy in Jesus but to trust and obey.

Declaration: Romans 8:1-14

21 "You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgement.' 22 But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgement; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, 'You fool!' will be liable to hell of fire. 29 So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, 24 leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. 25 Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are going with him to court, lest your accuser hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you be put in prison. 26 Truly, I say to you, you will never get out until you paid the last penny.

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' 28 But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart. 29 If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into

hell. 30 And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body go into hell.

31 "It was also said, 'Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.' 32 But I say to you that everyone who divorces his wife, except on the ground of sexual immorality, makes her commit adultery, and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

Affirmation: We will gladly respond to Jesus' call to take practical steps to live righteously!

ENGAGE

1. Discuss the significance of the words of Psalm 51:10, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a right spirit within me" and the words of the modern day song, "Give me a clean heart so I may serve thee" as they may relate to emphasis on the inner purity that contrasts with the former prescriptions of outward actions.

2. In groups of twos discuss what it is about evil in the hearts of humans that is so repulsive to God that Jesus is highly concerned about removing. Consider God's words in Genesis 8:21b: "I will never again curse the ground because of humankind, for the inclination of the human heart is evil from youth," Have you taken notice of such in the hearts of people you know?

3. Do you have problems controlling what is in your heart and mind when you are trying to do what you know is right? Do you ever experience the division between your inner and outer self?

EDUCATE

In this passage of Scripture, Jesus begins his famous teaching style, "You have heard..., but I say unto you," wherein he contrasts with and expands what is in the Law of Moses, interpreted in outward terms, with his own teaching that stresses the need for the inner transformative power that controls our outward selves. One commentary sees a basic three-part pattern, indicating that Jesus first "gives a statement of a

commandment from the Law of Moses, framed as something taught from ancient times. Second, he presents an expansion of this law as given by later teachers and interpreters. Third, Jesus announces a more rigorous version of this teaching, looking to root out the cause of the sin in the heart, not just the action itself" (Standard Lesson Commentary 2018-2019, p395).

Notably, as he details in 5:17-20, how God values internal righteousness more than external righteousness, Jesus builds upon this teaching by focusing on the spirit of the Mosaic law in regard to its teachings on murder and adultery in Matthew 5:21-32.

Vv. 21-22: Love transforms how we relate to one another. In what form does this transformation come? Jesus teaches us how to be a reflection of his light through controlling our anger, being reconciled with others, immediately dealing with sin, and being faithful. When Jesus refers to controlling one's anger toward a brother or sister, He is not talking only about a literal family member, instead, he is referring to all members of the family of God. The word hell in the text comes from the Greek word gehenna. The word appears often in Matthew to refer to the eternal destination of the wicked (see Matthew 5:29-30; 10:28; 18:9; 23:15, 33). Hell is not to be confused with Hades (Luke 16:23), which was the underworld for the dead (known as Sheol in the Old Testament).

Vv. 23-26: Outward acts of piety or sacrificial offerings have no impact before God in cases where we are in disharmony or at odds with our fellow humans. We are commanded to make things right between our fellows before we come before God's altar.

Vv. 27-30: Here is one passage where the mere thought itself or desire in the heart is called the actual outward commission of the sin, which places great emphasis on what is conceived inwardly. An inward searching and cleansing of oneself is crucial in finding purity before God. How is this possible? Jesus is speaking in hyperbole when saying one should mutilate his or her body parts if they cause a person to sin. But he does mean for the close examination of one's thoughts and self-cleaning to take place.

Vv. 31-32: Jesus cites Deuteronomy 24:1-4 in his discussion of divorce. Moses had made a provision for divorce, but this did not equate to God's preferred actions in marriage. God intended for a man and woman to remain married for life because of their becoming one.

Regarding divorce, Matthew 5:32 mentions the exception of adultery, but the parallel in Luke 16:18 does not.

ELEVATE

As mentioned before, Jesus places before us in his Sermon the ideals that we are to strive for if we would be kingdom-dwellers. We must undergo a fundamental self-searching and self-cleansing as children of God. We must acknowledge our sin before God and seek to live the life of purity that is pleasing to God. But can we do this on our own? Certainly, we cannot. And that is why we have an advocate, Jesus himself, and the Holy Spirit to come to our aid. As believers, the Spirit of Christ is within us to teach, strengthen, and guide us in achieving the purity and righteousness God requires of us. But we must yield to the Spirit and allow it to work in us to make us pleasing to God. Jesus has already atoned for our sins and relieved us of the burden and responsibility of them, but we must be strong in the Spirit in resisting the temptation to sin.

We must be able to discern the difference between behavior motivated by external conformity and that which arises from inner convictions. What is the appeal of superficial or hypocritical religiosity? What steps can we take to move beyond such behavior and serve God out of the inner purity that Jesus commands? The Holy Spirit is our teacher in this and we must let the Spirit have its way.

I THINK:

1. Compare and contrast living by the letter of the Law to living by the spirit of the law.
2. Give personal example of when you have had to reconcile with other believers. How did you feel prior to reconciliation? How did you feel afterward?
3. Facilitate a discussion on figurative language used throughout the Bible. How do Christians know when to interpret a passage figuratively or literally?
4. Discuss the damaging effects of adultery to marriage. What are the physical, emotional, and spiritual consequences that accompany adultery?
5. List ways you can guard against being angry with brothers and sisters in Christ or entertaining lustful thoughts.

VERSE OF THE WEEK:

When you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift. Matthew 5:23-24.

W.W.II. Watching him, we worried that although he had survived W.W.II, he may not make it through our changing uptown neighborhood with its ever-increasing random violence, gangs, and drug activity.

When he saw the flyer at our local church asking for volunteers for caring for the gardens behind the minister's residence, he responded in his characteristically unassuming manner. Without fanfare, he just signed up. He was well into his 87th year when the very thing we had always feared finally happened.

He was just finishing his watering for the day when three gang members approached him. Ignoring their attempt to intimidate him, he simply asked, Would you like a drink from the hose? The tallest and toughest-looking of the three said, Yeah, sure, with a malevolent little smile. As Carl offered the hose to him, the other two grabbed Carl's arm, throwing him down. As the hose snaked crazily over the ground, dousing everything in its way, Carl's assailants stole his retirement watch and his wallet, and then fled.

Carl tried to get himself up, but he had been thrown down on his bad leg. He lay there trying to gather himself as the minister came running to help him. Although the minister had witnessed the attack from his window, he couldn't get there fast enough to stop it. Carl, are you okay? Are you hurt? The minister kept asking as he helped Carl to his feet.

Carl just passed a hand over his brow and sighed, shaking his head. Just some punk kids. I hope they'll wise-up someday. His wet clothes clung to his slight frame as he bent to pick up the hose. He adjusted the nozzle again and started to water. Confused and a little concerned, the minister asked, Carl, what are you doing? I've got to finish my watering. It's been very dry lately, came the calm reply. Satisfying himself that Carl really was all right, the minister could only marvel. Carl was a man from a different time and place.

A few weeks later the three returned. Just as before their threat was unchallenged. Carl again offered them a drink from his hose. This time they didn't rob him. They wrenched the hose from his hand and drenched him head to foot in the icy water. When they had finished their humiliation of him, they sauntered off down the street, throwing catcalls and curses, falling over one another laughing at the hilarity of what they had just done. Carl just watched them. Then he turned toward the warmth giving sun, picked up his hose, and went on with his watering.

The summer was quickly fading into fall. Carl was doing some tilling when he was startled by the sudden approach of someone behind him. He stumbled and fell into some evergreen branches. As he struggled to regain his footing, he turned to see the tall leader of his summer tormentors reaching down for him. He braced himself for the expected attack.

Don't worry old man, I'm not gonna hurt you this time. The young man spoke softly, still offering the tattooed and scarred hand to Carl. As he helped Carl get up, the man pulled a crumpled bag from his pocket and handed it to Carl. What's this? Carl asked. It's your stuff, the man explained. It's your stuff back. Even the money in your wallet. I don't understand, Carl said. Why would you help me now? The man shifted his feet, seeming embarrassed and ill at ease. I learned something from you, he said. I ran with that gang and hurt people like you. We picked you because you were old and we knew we could do it. But every time we came and did something to you, instead of yelling and fighting back, you tried to give us a drink. You didn't hate us for hating you. You kept showing love against our hate. He stopped for a moment. I couldn't sleep after we stole your stuff, so here it is back. He paused for another awkward moment, not knowing what more there was to say. That bag's my way of saying thanks for straightening me out, I guess. And with that, he walked off down the street. Carl

looked down at the sack in his hands and gingerly opened it. He took out his retirement watch and put it back on his wrist. Opening his wallet, he checked for his wedding photo. He gazed for a moment at the young bride that still smiled back at him from all those years ago.

He died one cold day after Christmas that winter. Many people attended his funeral in spite of the weather. The man went to work and, over the next several years, he tended the flowers and vegetables just as Carl had done. In that time, he went to college, got married, and became a prominent member of the community. But he never forgot his promise to Carl's memory and kept the garden as beautiful as he thought Carl would have kept it. One day he approached the new minister and told him that he couldn't care for the garden any longer. He explained with a shy and happy smile, My wife just had a baby boy last night, and she's bringing him home on Saturday.

says, "The just shall live by faith" and "Without faith it's impossible to please God" and "Whatsoever is not of faith is sin" and "According to your faith it will be done unto you."

God always operates in your life by faith. That's why you need goals in your life, because a goal is a statement of faith. A goal says, "I believe God wants me to accomplish something by a certain date." If you don't have a date, it's not a goal. It's a wish. It's a dream. It's a desire. But wishes are a dime a dozen; they're worthless. The only thing that will change your life is setting a goal. You've got to wake up from the dream and go to work!

A "FAITH" goal has five characteristics:

Focused. That means it is specific. If you use the words "more" or "less," it's not a focused goal. "I want to be less angry" or "I want to weigh less" or "I

want to be more like Jesus" are not goals because you can't measure them. You have to be specific.

Attainable. If you set an unrealistic goal, it's just going to discourage you. If you say, "I'm going to pray three hours a day," you're setting yourself up for failure. Set a goal that stretches you and then trust God will help you stretch.

Individual. That means it's personal. You cannot set goals for other people because you can't control them. You can't set goals for your children, your husband, or your boyfriend or girlfriend. You can only set goals for yourself, because you can control you and not anybody else. The only way you can change other people is by changing yourself.

Trackable. Trackable goals can be measured. They're verifiable. You set a date and say, "By Nov. 30 I will have accomplished this, and by Dec. 30 I will have accomplished this, and by Jan. 30 I will have accomplished this."

Heartfelt. Your goals have got to be heartfelt. You'll never reach a passionless goal. If you're not passionate about the goal, wait until you get passionate about it. If you don't have a deep desire to do it, don't set it.

I encourage you to set one spiritual goal for your life today. Maybe your goal is to have a quiet time for five minutes every day for the next month. That is a FAITH goal, and you can accomplish it in faith.

"All five Duanys graduated with academic honors, and Nyagon was the valedictorian of her class." Remember Omeka Okafor of University of Connecticut?

The original story was by L. Jon Wertheim and was adopted for the magazine with permission from the publishers, Putnam. If you follow NCAA March Madness, when Syracuse won the 2003 title the senior captain was Kueth Duany, one of the five children of Wal and Julia Duany. He "graduated with a double major in political science and information management and technology".

The story caught my attention for a very good reason. There is a school of thought that proposes that today's generation of African American children and their families have "no more excuses" to use as reason for not making "something of themselves". In fact, the principal of Keigwin Middle School, in his Black History Month presentation at Cross Street, used as his theme the same "no more excuses" theory. Coming from a school that has only recently been nationally recognized for its outstanding and spectacular achievements with the children, one would be excused if one became the latest graduate of this school of thought. Rather than quickly jumping to the conclusion that what one family had been able to do any other family should be able to duplicate, I still kept looking for the magic bullet.

Somewhere in the article, you will read this line: *"To the Duanys, those aren't unusual achievements so much as the normal fruits of opportunity. Their kids, they maintain, aren't necessarily extraordinary; they simply show what children with a structured upbringing can achieve."* Do you or do you not think that the Duany's assertion supports the "no more excuses" theory? I don't think so.

As I went through the story I finally hit it – the magic bullet. Here is what it says. *"Last year to his coach's dismay Bil, (the last of the five children) made barely half of his foul shots. There was even some doubt that he'd close the family circle by earning a Division I scholarship – not because he lacked game but because, like a lot of American teenagers, he lacked RESOLVE"* – caps are mine.

I am prepared to state without any hint of doubt in my mind that the magic word is "**RESOLVE**" and that applies in almost every endeavor of today's generation of children, ever more so with African American children. Resolve is powered by determination and resolution. It is the solid fixation of unflinching purpose. You don't teach 'resolve'. Resolve - the lack of it, and the inability of today's adults (and authorities) to understand the underlying principles of it, is the reason for most of our children not taking advantage of today's opportunities.

Who is right then, the "no more excuses" theorists or me? I insist that any child with any amount of "**RESOLVE**" can make it in this society of abundant opportunities and will need no excuses for any reason. Pure and simple. For years, I have championed a principle which I call the 'threshold' theory. It states that if you match two toads (one of which can jump exactly 9 inches with another that can jump up to 11 inches) on a ladder that has 10 inch gaps in the rungs, the mere 2 inch disadvantage will mean the difference between getting to the top of the ladder and never, ever clearing even the first rung. That meager 2 inches can clearly be viewed as lack of "**RESOLVE**". For businesses, it is the lack of "**PRODUCTIVITY**". For countries, it has always been the lack of "**TECHNOLOGY**". At this point I am saying that when it comes to today's children of this generation it is the complex, psychological phenomenon that is called "**RESOLVE**".

In the Duanys story, it is interesting to note that all the four older siblings urged their youngest brother's coach to be 'tough' on him in the hope of extracting the necessary 'RESOLVE' out of him to enable him to live to the family's legacy. It worked.

Today's issues are much more complex than before. As we strive for more of liberty, and freedom and opportunities, we have to contend with the accompanying menace of lack of 'fire' and 'passion' in the eyes of the new generation. No single solution appears to work. The days when our parents used one panacea to cure all ailments are long gone. What we still have with us, though, is the capacity to rise to the occasion and to be bigger than someone else has defined for us. Institutions such as churches and families have quite a series of challenges to meet. One way to help is to become more than we ever thought – centers of thought and reason. In my mind's eyes I can see Cross Street, for example, promoting regular panel discussions on various secular topics relevant to the community at large in its quest to meet some of these challenges of today.

For Steps for Studying the Word

“My son, attend to my words; incline thine ear unto my saying.”
Proverbs 4:20 KJV

Many people have asked me how to study God’s Word. Here are four helpful tips:

1. Purposely set aside time. I make an appointment with God in the mornings, but if that work for you, find a time that does, even if it’s not every day. Just start somewhere and you’ll see the positive fruit

that this time brings to your life!

2. make preparation for your Bible study. Choose a place that you enjoy being, a room in your house where you can be alone.

3. Have all your materials available. You’ll want your Bible, of course, but also get a good Bible dictionary, concordance, pen and paper. That way, you don’t have to stop every few minutes to reference something or write something down.

4. Prepare your heart. Talk to God

about things you may need to confess, and enter your study time peacefully and without anything that may block you from receiving revelation during your study.

Take the time to study the Word because there is power in it to change your life and become the person God wants you to be.

Prayer Starter: Lord, I purpose in my heart to set aside time to really study Your Word. Teach me how to understand, consent and submit to your truth in my life every day.

Waiting Expectantly

“Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find, and knock, and it shall be opened unto you:”
Matthew 7:7 KJV

Have you been praying about a situation in your life and found yourself waiting for a breakthrough? Are you wondering why the answer hasn’t come yet? Do you feel as though victory is passing you by?

Sometimes when we pray long and hard about a situation in our life without receiving any answers, we just learn to live with it. We go on about our business, wondering if or when God will send the answer. But God does hear those prayers, and He’s working out the answers even though we may not know all the details. Our situation can change suddenly, quickly, without warning!

Until then we can either wait passively or expectantly. A passive person gives up, but the expectant person, on the other

hand, is hopeful, believing the answer is just around the corner, due to arrive any minute. His belief is not a passive thing. His heart is full of hope, expecting his problem to be solved at any moment. He wakes up every morning expecting to find his answer. He may wait and wait, but he’ll keep asking until suddenly, God turns everything around.

Prayer Starter: I want to wait expectantly not passively. I’ll keep asking You for my breakthrough, knowing full well that You’ll bring it at the right time.

“God Causes Things to Happen at the Right Time”

“For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry.” Habakkuk 2:3

Are you waiting for the desires of your heart to begin to manifest? Are you praying for bondages to fall off of you so you can see your dreams come to pass? Are you waiting and praying for the salvation of friends and family? Are you

trusting God for prosperity, favor, promotion, honor, and all the blessings found in His Word?

Are you tired of waiting for harvest time in your life? Are you frustrated, crying out, “When, God, when?” Then you need to understand that God’s timing is often a mystery. He doesn’t do things on our timetable. Yet His Word promises that He will not be late, not one single day.

God causes things to happen at exactly the right time! Your job is not to figure out when, but to make up your mind

that you won’t give up until you cross the finish line and are living in the radical, outrageous blessings of God! The more you trust Jesus and keep your eyes focused on Him, the more life you’ll have. Trusting God brings life. Believing brings rest. So stop trying to figure everything out, and let God be God in your life.

Prayer Starter: God, I know that Your timing is perfect, even when I grow tired of waiting. Help me to trust in You and rest in Your plan for me.

“Sharing in His Suffering”

“For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us.” Romans 8:18

As Christians, we like the thought of sharing in Christ’s glory, but what about sharing in His suffering? Jesus took care of the death penalty once and for all so we don’t ever have to worry about that again. But the Bible teaches that we must suffer times of trial if we are to share in the glory. Is it worth it? According to Romans 8:18, it certainly is!

We tend to believe that we suffer because of our circumstances and if they would only change, we’d be able to act right. But God wants us to become so mature and stable that we act right even when none of our circumstances are good. There are different levels of faith, and most of time we want to use our faith to get rid of all suffering. But sometimes God’s plan is for us to exercise a higher level of faith that will carry us through life’s challenges.

Too often we marvel at the delivering power of God and overlook His keeping,

strengthening and enabling power. Jesus promised in John 16:33 that He will give us His peace during the trials of life and the power we need to overcome them. I encourage you today, if you are going through a time of suffering, take heart because in Christ, you will come through it and share in His glory which shall be revealed!

Prayer Starter: Lord, Paul said that present sufferings are nothing compared to the glory that comes from walking with You. I want to have that same attitude. I receive Your enabling power to walk through any suffering that comes my way.
