TELECONFERENCE; Minutes from June 1, 2020**

The June 1, 2020 meeting of Crestwood Association was called to order by President, Janine Lund at 7:02 p.m. Janine welcomed all in attendance, including Guests NPO, Oscar Moncada, and Catherine Huckabee from the City of Fort Worth Community Engagement office.

PRESENTATION

Catherine Huckabee provided a presentation about the many services of the Community Engagement office. She noted that bulletins which go out to the community, in both English and Spanish, update the City daily on community resources regarding COVID 19. Information is gotten to the public via community leaders, NextDoor and the City's website, www.fortworthtexas.gov. She also informed the group that all City employees are working remotely until the Governor opens the City offices back up. In addition, the City website has a section outlining good news that's happened in an effort to provide encouragement, as well. She informed the group of the City Council Meeting on Thursday, June 4 at 3:00, and encouraged any interested to

speak if they so desired. The meeting will be held in a live format, also accessed virtually. Those interested should contact the City Secretary's office at 817-392-4020, or go to the City's website. Ms. Huckabee informed members that the 2020 election has been moved to July 14th, with early voting on June 29 through July 10, 2020.

Rollcall was taken and it was determined a quorum was present. Minutes of the April meeting were accepted as written.

COMMITTEE REPORTS & NEW BUSINESS

FINANCIAL UPDATE: Janine updated members on the treasurer's report in Treasurer, Rozi Stone's stead: Rozi has ordered checks with the updated information. She noted that, because of temporarily ceasing room rental at Central Christian Church for meetings, the budget balance is more than expected. In addition, there have been positive membership dues. A motion was made and carried, to provide the Church half the meeting cost of \$100 per month (for a total of \$150) toward lost operating costs.

RUMMAGE SALE: Central Christian Church is holding a rummage sale and invites all to safely bring donations to the parking lot. It was suggested that donors contact Ryan at CCC at 817-335-1520, to let him know when items would be dropped off prior to doing so. The Church will also pick up large items from donors, if needed.

BLOOD DRIVE: Held at CCC June 9 between 12:00 and 6:00. An email with details and opportunity to sign up, will go out shortly.

CRIME PATROL/SECURITY REPORT: Frank Diaz and June Morton relayed crime in the neighborhood to include an auto theft at the Monticello apartments on April 10, a house burglary at 600 Eastwood on April 14, another auto theft April 23 at the Monticello apartments; and an auto theft at 800 Northwood. Members were encouraged, again, to keep car doors locked. Officer Moncada spoke to the drag racing on University and informed members of three fatalities as a result. In addition, he relayed that the area of Rockwood Park, whereby racers were doing donuts in the lot, has been addressed with the use of a gate around the area, and the placement boulders in the lot. He will be providing an article to address these issues in the upcoming newsletter. Officer Moncada provided his contact information: 817-944-2725; oscar.moncada@fortworthtexas.gov. June reminded members of the vote on the 1.5 cent tax increase at the July 14 election.
