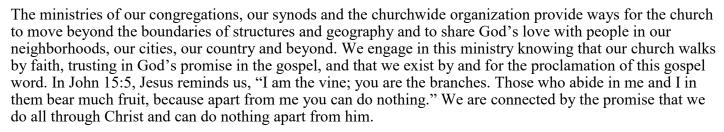

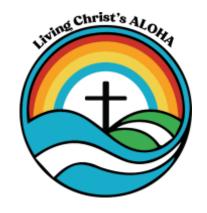

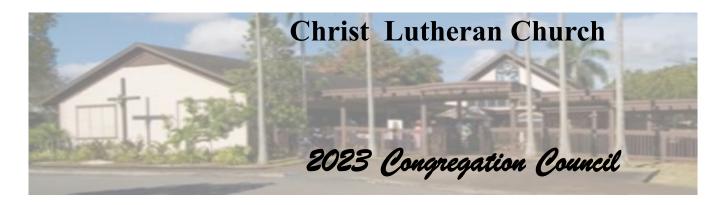
What a Beautiful Parking Lot!

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 2023

³²But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. ³³Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. Mark 13:32-33

Aloha Dear Friends & Members of CLC:

Throughout Scripture, Jesus & the writers of the New Testament urge their listeners to "Be alert!" and to "Keep Awake." For we no not the hour The above passage from Mark is a good example of this call from Jesus to us.



I have been talking about staying on our toes – being alert and keeping awake – for much of the latter part of 2023. A colleague of mine mentioned recently that we are in liminal times – on the threshold of something. I have used the term "inflection point," meaning "a point at which a major or decisive change takes place." (cf. Dictionary.com)

The year 2023 felt like we were on the threshold of something. It was the year we realized that there was no going back to 2019. Religion and politics, culture and society, economics and finance, climate and weather are all at an inflection point and we had better pay attention. We had better "keep awake" and "be alert." The ride this year could get bumpy.

There is an acronym I used last year to break down and analyze how we are doing ... it is called **SWEEP**, for Stewardship, Worship, Education, Evangelism, and Property. It often helps me see things more clearly. Let me try using it again here.

Stewardship – as I said throughout the year, "We are doing okay financially." Not great, not bad, but okay. Our cash reserves have dropped, since we had some major capital expenses, especially repairs for preschool accreditation and resealing the parking lot. Those expenses will not come due, for another five years. Our stewardship of our other resources has gone okay, too. We use stuff over and over. I would like to see us further expand our understanding of stewardship – to steward of all creation, that we our God's stewards of the land, sea, and air.

Worship – this remains central to who we are: the Body of Christ, proclaiming in Word and sacrament God's resurrecting love for us and all of creation. Attendance has remained steady, with members departing and new members arriving. My thanks to everyone who has kept things going, whether in the foreground or the background. Altar Guild, AV/IT, setup and cleanup, Assisting Ministers and supply preachers, and above all Emily and Tom for their wonderful ministry of music.

Education – Keiki School has revived! That is the big news for 2023. Mahalos to Bekki, Andrew, and Elaine for stepping up and jumping in. We want to spread the word and invite keiki six through twelve to join us in between worship services. Stay tuned this year for a men's group and another "Lutheranism 101" session or two. We will also hold our Lenten soup suppers and Bible study, beginning Wednesday, February 21st, 6pm supper & 7pm study.

Evangelism – declaring God's unconditional love for us in Christ is at the heart of the Lutheran Movement. "By grace alone" we are redeemed. I am more and more aware that that message has been lost on young people, who are abandoning organized religion in droves, mainly because of the legalistic hypocrisy and abuse they have felt and seen in churches. We used to "evangelize" by having babies who grew up to become church members. Not anymore. Think about who we are and whom you might invite to join us in worship and study, who might benefit from hearing about God's love in Christ, all without condition.

Property – if we are not careful, this task can become all-consuming. Because it is a big responsibility. Resealing the parking lot, painting, lock repair, ongoing maintenance of a myriad of little-but-big things. My thanks to the Lawn Guyz, Paul and Russ especially for weekly tending to our two acres of the Garden of Eden. They have been faithful for years and I am grateful. They will be needing some help this year as travel plans and planned medical procedures are going to hinder their weekly work. So, if you can, please let us know if you can help out.

Pastoral Duties - It has been a busy year for me, especially with travel to the continent, both scheduled and unscheduled. The lifting of the pandemic state of emergency last spring certainly fired up a busy-ness that I am not sure I am appreciating yet. My thanks to all of you when my sister died unexpectedly in June and I had to go back to Ohio for her funeral. My thanks also when I came down with Covid, yet again on a plane flight. I am really not excited about travelling this year. I was exhausted early in the day for weeks after the Covid itself abated. I think it was a combination of delayed grief for my sister and, as the doctor said, a side effect of Covid. I finally started feeling more myself after Thanksgiving.

Finally, mahalo nui loa to my partner in Crime and Gospel, our Parish Administrator, Shelby Yuu, who has kept me – and many of us – awake, alert, and organized. I could not be doing what I am doing without her support and hard work.

Stay alert, siblings in Christ. We have accomplished much, but there is more ahead. And the ride could indeed get bumpy this year. I continue to pray for you. Please, pray for us.

As we have in the past, the council and I would like to give a big thanks to all our volunteers. They are the members and non-members who do so many of the things necessary to keep the church going and stay within its budget.

In late 2022 the Council implemented the 3rd Sunday potluck held between services in hopes that there would be more personal interaction and the first and second service folks could get better acquainted. Those who participate meet members and non-members and enjoy each other's fellowship. We want to extend another invitation to everyone to take some time and join us between services.

In 2023 we seal coated the parking lot, moved the parking bumpers, and widened many spaces to make it easier to park and get in and out of cars.

There was a significant number of small repairs throughout the campus to ensure that Rainbow School met its accreditation requirements. This maintenance is necessary to keep good tenants.

Keiki Sunday school is back up and running this year. If you have keiki, please give it a try. If you know of someone looking for a church that has Keiki school, be sure to invite them to check it out.

This year we began the process of installing photo voltaic panels on the church and parsonage. Actual installation probably won't start until summer of 2024 as it takes time for engineering and permitting to take place.

We re-started the Christmas parade this year and it was well received by the community. CLC volunteers handed out Lei along the parade route and coffee, tea, and hot chocolate at the church.

Catechism is up and running with 4 of our youth attending this year.

In 2023, Church attendance has been steady and if we look at in person and on-line views, attendance has increased.

In the coming year the council looks forward to input from all of you. Reach out to any of us to help address your concerns. If there are opportunities to volunteer, please consider doing so.

Aloha CLC Members,

The IHS ministry team was again in full force during 2023, serving our community members who needed assistance. We served six times throughout the year and delivered over 2000 meals to residents of the Sumner Avenue men's shelter along with outlying shelters throughout the greater Honolulu area. It is always a pleasure to work with the staff at IHS and deliver much-needed assistance through our dinner serving.

This year we witnessed an increase in the cost of chicken at the grocery stores. At the onset of 2023, we went to the church council and asked for additional funding to not only cover the increase in chicken prices but to increase the amount of chicken we provided. With the approval from the church council, we increased our chicken donation to 200 pounds and were able to feed additional meals throughout the year.

With every program, there comes change. Jefery and Amanda Spangler have been running the CLC IHS ministry team since December 2017. As Jefery makes his transition out of military service in 2024, it is time to hand the baton off to another church member to continue doing the great work with IHS. Mr. Adam Palmer has accepted the call to carry on the CLC IHS ministry team and he began as the program manager in December of 2023. Jefery and Amanda would like to thank each patron that has supported the program and all the volunteers that made the mission a success during their tenure.

As the team prepares for another year of serving our community in 2024, we ask that everyone looks at what they can do to support this great program. From cookie donations to serving in the kitchen at IHS, there are so many rewarding ways to get involved. We look forward to continued service and providing this much-needed resource in our community.

2023 Rainbow School Annual Report

Rainbow School Mililani at Christ Lutheran Church has 33 students enrolled. There are two three-year-old classes and one four-year-old class. Our services are intended to meet the needs of young children

between two years and six years of age. The school runs year-round from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and with a few exceptions follow the same holiday schedule as the local public schools, including Spring and Christmas break.

Rainbow School believes in a developmentally appropriate curriculum for all enrolled children as outlined by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). Our staff believes that children learn most effectively through a concrete, play-oriented approach to early childhood education, as opposed to an academic approach.

Lailene Abalos-Calma is the new director taking on the position after being a teacher here in the four-year-old class for 13 years. Tiffani Brooks and JerriLynn Raymond Ayau are the teachers in the other 3-year-old class and Ada Rivera is their aide with 11 children. Kammi Kama is the teacher in the four-year-old class.

Krystel Cortez, Raysa Phipps, and Rachel Scott are her aides with 22 children. Lehua Leahano is the floater for the 3 and 4-year-old classes. Kina Hensley is the teacher in the after-school program.

We are now re-accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). The accreditation visit was in September. Our accreditation is valid for 5 years. Each year an annual report needs to be completed to make sure that we are upholding our standards.

Diversified Exterminators sprays around the buildings and yard for roaches and ants on a monthly basis. Our annual fundraiser is helping us update the playground structures.

Goal for the year 2024 is to continue to raise funds to finish our playground renovations. We would like to add swings and safety surfacing in the second phase. We would also like to strengthen our partnership in the community, by participating in events with the Mililani Town Association and Mililani High School. Another goal is to acquire another teacher as our existing staff are working towards that goal by obtaining the proper credentials. We will then be able to open the other 4-year-old class increasing our enrollment.

Our role is to amplify and focus the learning already taking place in children's lives by guiding them toward four goals: basic development, a deeper awareness of the world and their place in it, creative expression and the ability to make effective choices.

We have opened up our school after COVID-19 restrictions for the past 3 years, as families are now allowed back on our premises while we are still maintaining frequent cleaning and sanitizing of our school and facility. We are now allowing visitors back onto campus such as Mililani High School, HFD, HPD, and Hawaii Theater for Youth. We are also started our extracurricular activities back up, such as Soccer Shots, Amazing Athletes, and Island Tumblers Gymnastics. We also saw the return of our annual Ohana Fun Day and potluck as well as our beloved Christmas Program.

2023 OPERATING RESULTS SUMMARY FOR THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2023

Christ Lutheran Church had total operating revenue and support of \$237,416.39 for the twelve-month period ending December 31, 2023, \$3,386.92 higher than expenses of \$234,029.47. The actual operating gain of \$3,386.92 is \$573.92 more than the projected 2023 surplus of \$2,813.00.

Revenue totaled \$237,416.39 for the twelve-month period compared with \$222,986.23 the previous year, an increase of \$14,430.16 or 6.47 percent. Worship donations decreased by \$2,586.48 or 12.6 percent compared to 2022. Simply Giving donations saw an increase of \$1,585 or 7.8 percent. Pay It Forward donations rose by \$980. Numbered envelope donations increased \$5,069 from \$22,975 in 2022, to \$28,044 in 2023. Tithe.ly saw another increase to \$36,267, marking a continued trend in moving away from traditional giving mechanisms – numbered envelopes – to internet-based donation. Facility use and rental income remained consistent, only decreasing slightly by \$57.97 compared to 2022.

Expenses totaled \$234,029.47 for the twelve-month period compared with \$219,146.71 the previous year, an increase of \$14,882.29 or 6.8 percent. Despite this increase, expenses came under the 2023 budget by \$11,184.53.

Christ Lutheran Church is fortunate to be blessed by the tremendous efforts of Shelby Yuu, our Office Administrator; Carolyn Koehler, our Bookkeeper who maintained CLC's QuickBooks account in 2023; and Audra Furukawa, an independent CPA providing pro bono accounting support and review. 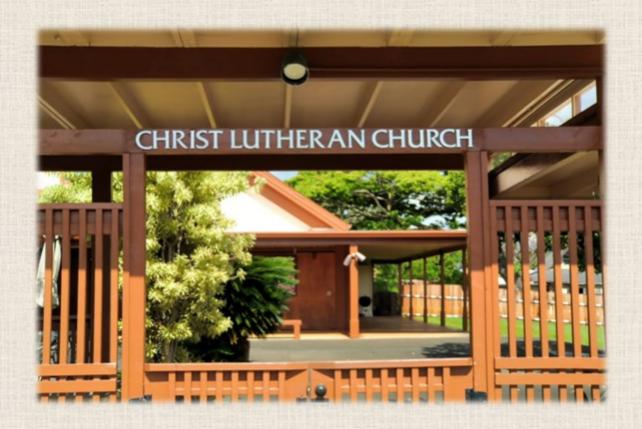
