On August 14th we began conducting beta testing of our brand-new online registration system. We had a few hiccups, but overall it was a tremendous success! We are working out the bugs right now and expect to go live with a full general registration this month. No more checks!! No more hoping your registration paperwork arrives in time!! Everyone will have the same opportunity to register for study groups at the same time, regardless of where you reside right now. **Watch for the e-blast with links to the online registration system** and follow the instructions to select your study group choices and pay with a credit card. Remember, study groups are for members only, so make sure your BNC membership is current and your contact information, especially your email address, is correct.

This year, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, all our groups will be virtual groups conducted via Zoom. Some of your favorite in-person groups are "on-hiatus" until we have both permission from BNC National to meet face-to-face and we in Arizona believe it is safe to do so. We hope to have a second registration period for these groups later in the year. However, as we have seen from the positive response to the virtual Summer Camp programming, the online experience can be just as entertaining and as fun as in-person groups. To ensure you have a great experience, there will be training sessions in September for our wonderful facilitators on how to be effective on Zoom.

The cost per study group is \$20 for all groups, plus any additional costs for materials. Since many groups fill quickly, register as soon as you can! If you've joined our groups before, then you already know how wonderful they are; if you're a new member, you have a real treat in store. Look through the Study Group Guide, when it becomes available, to prepare yourself for online registration. If a group is full when you register, you will be asked if you wish to be put on a waiting list. Openings will be filled from the wait list. If the wait lists get too long, we will endeavor to find a new facilitator to start a second group, or perhaps you might want to become a facilitator yourself. We are happy to provide training and mentorship for all new facilitators.

Many of your favorite groups are returning, plus there are brand new offerings for a total of **46 groups** with engaging, informative and interesting activities. Many groups will start meeting the beginning of October. The **Study Group Guide** containing detailed descriptions of all the groups, with the times and days they meet, will be available very soon on our website at www.brandeisphoenix.org/study-groups.html.

To pique your interest, here are a few of the NEW study groups being offered this year.



BOOKS: Brandeis members love to read. In addition to many of the returning book groups reading contemporary fiction and nonfiction works, we have some new book groups starting this season. These include *Show Me the Money,* reading books about famous money makers and investors; *Books that Define an Era*, discussing the mood of the country and why the book chosen represents that period in time; *Law Whisperers*, reading memoirs by or about famous judges or attorneys and books about famous legal cases.

CINEMA/THEATER: If you like going to the movies, we have two new groups this year utilizing Netflix and Prime Video streaming services. *Movies of the Heart* will be watching uplifting contemporary films and we have *Le Cinéma Français*, for lovers of French films. Plus, we have added a *Live Theater Happy Hour* group, which will view live theater productions online and discuss them via Zoom.

HEALTH/FITNESS: Stay fit with BNC friends! We have added *Intermediate Hatha Yoga*, *Meditation*, and *Why Men Need to Get Back to the Gym*, a discussion group about exercise and fitness. Plus, we have a group dealing with COVID-19, called *Creating Emotional Resilience: During and After the Pandemic*.

DISCUSSION GROUPS: Lots of new and interesting discussion groups are on tap for this year, as well. There is *News and Politics* that will bring folks together to discuss national and international news each week; *Great Decisions*, based on the topics in the Foreign Policy Association 2021 briefing book and video; a new group for men called *Restless Minds for Men*, and a *Women of Substance* group to highlight important contemporary and historical women. For those who wish to stroll down memory lane and discuss old radio shows, we have a new offering called *The Golden Age of Radio*.

SPECIAL INTERESTS: Of course, we have many new groups devoted to the special interests of our members. There is *Learning More About DSLR Photography* for those who want to improve their photography skills, and *Loom Knitting for Fun* for anyone interested in learning a new craft. For those wanting to explore the Yiddish language and recall some vocabulary from their past, we have *Yiddish for Nostalgia and the Brain*. There is also a new educational group called *Holocaust Education - Up Close and Personal*, with first-hand presentations from second-generation chapter members; and finally, a cooking group called *Ethnic Jewish Cooking and Eating*, exploring old and new Jewish recipes.



Flo, a Phoenix native, holds degrees from Arizona State University (Master of Social Work), University of Arizona and Phoenix College.

Visionary Leadership: What Does It Look Like?

A native New Yorker, Carol arrived in Paradise Valley in 1983 and joined the Phoenix Chapter, continuing her long-standing connection with BNC and Brandeis University.

Carol has served as Phoenix Chapter President, Western Region President, and National President of BNC. She was re-elected to the National Presidency for an unprecedented second term to assist in restructuring the organization. She established the Phoenix Book & Author event, which celebrated its 30th anniversary in 2020, raising funds for scientific/medical research and scholarship at Brandeis. She is National Campaign Co-Chair for the current BNC Campaign, *Honoring Our History*. Carol was elected as a Fellow of Brandeis University, President's Councilor and served several terms on the Board of Trustees.

In addition, Carol has brought her considerable fundraising talents to other organizations in the Valley. She chaired the annual Hospice of the Valley Art Auction (AHAA) and currently serves on AHAA as a committee member. She received the Paul J. Mahoney Award for Fund Raising from Hospice of the Valley (HOV) and initiated Garage Sales that helped start the HOV Thrift Stores around the Valley.

Carol originated and chaired the Women's Symposium (formerly Women's Works) for the Jewish Federation of Greater Phoenix that annually hosts Jewish women and local organizations for a day of learning. She chaired the Lion Division, served as Campaign Vice President and serves on various committees.

She is a Governance Board Member of Jewish Family and Children's Service, was previously the Governance Board Chair and continues to serve on many committees. She has long been affiliated with Hadassah Valley of the Sun, National Council of Jewish Women, Phoenix Art Museum and the Scottsdale Museum of Contemporary Art. Carol received the Israel Bonds Jerusalem 3000 Medal of Honor in 1996.

Carol has been married to Allan for 56 years, has two sons, Bradley - married to Jennifer, Evan - married to Dana, and has six wonderful grandchildren – five boys, one girl.

In May 2018, a \$1 billion natural gas-fired power plant commenced operations in Oxford, Connecticut. The project, Towantic Energy Center, was the culmination of twenty years of effort by Janis Lipman, through her company, Arena Capital Ltd. Arena was established by Janis in 1990 to finance and develop "clean energy," including natural gas, solar and wind projects, in an effort to rid the U.S. of older, polluting, oil and coal-fired power plants. The project meets the electricity needs of approximately one million households and is the second largest natural gas-fueled power generator in New England.

Prior to forming Arena, Janis was a Managing Director, Global Project Finance Advisory at Union Bank of Switzerland where she provided advisory services to numerous infrastructure and energy projects throughout the US, Canada and Latin America. This included sourcing funding through global capital markets and international banks as well as multilateral and export credit agencies.

Janis also worked for General Electric Capital Corporation where, among other supervisory responsibilities, she served as Managing Director of the Utility Group. Before joining GE Capital, she was District Manger of GATX Financial Services Corporation and a financial analyst for the Bank of New York. She holds a BA in Economics from Skidmore College. Janis and her husband, Greg Altschuh, reside in Phoenix, AZ, where they have fostered ten dogs for the Arizona Animal Welfare League.

Since coming to Arizona in 2006, Janis has become active in the Brandeis National Committee, serving as a member of its Phoenix Chapter Board and as a facilitator of numerous Study Groups. She also has assisted educational and metro area fundraising events for the International Rescue Committee and served on its Micro Enterprise Loan Credit Committee. Janis and Greg have two children: Adam is a psychologist in Boston and Lauren is an ER physician in San Diego.





This campaign will provide global electronic access to these materials, ensuring that researchers and students will continue learning from these significant historical perspectives.

The Brandeis National Committee has existed to support Brandeis University in fulfilling its founding principles of access, inclusivity, and tolerance since 1948. In conjunction with President Ron Liebowitz's Framework for Our Future, the Honoring Our History campaign will strive to fulfill the founding principles of access, inclusivity and tolerance by supporting digitization of the Brandeis Library's unique collections highlighting social justice.

These special collections, including the Leo Frank Trial Collection, the Helmut Hirsch Collection. the Jewish Feminism Collection, and the University Photography Collection, provide insight into the narratives of 20th century men and women living in a time of overt antisemitism, racism, and institutionalized sexism. This campaign will support the entire process of digitization, which includes ensuring the discoverability of these narratives outside of the Brandeis community and enabling forms of digital scholarship that can be used in schools and in research internationally. These unique collections, much like the narratives found within them, deserve to not only exist and not be forgotten, but to be heard, shared, and appreciated.

Honoring Our History helps to navigate learning for the future.

One of the reasons we support Brandeis University is because of its commitment to Social Justice. That is why the current campaign, *Honoring Our History*, is so important.

As you've probably seen, our old photos fade and deteriorate only to be thrown away, never to be seen again -- family history lost forever.

The Brandeis University Library has in its possession many unique historical collections. These files are part of the social justice history Brandeis University is going to preserve for future generations to learn and care about. With digitization, scholars from all over the world will be able to learn about the terrible injustices that Jews, people of color and women have suffered. With this knowledge, hopefully we can move forward to a more just society for all of us.

Each month, we are going to highlight one of the remarkable collections. The Leo Frank Trial Collection has been chosen for this month.

Leo Frank Trial Collection

Leo Frank was a Jewish man, raised in Brooklyn and a graduate of Cornell University. He was convicted in 1913 of the murder of a 13-year employee, Mary Phagan, in Atlanta, Georgia. His trial, conviction and appeals attracted national attention. He was found guilty and sentenced to death. Two years later, when his death sentence was commuted, he was lynched. This became the focus of social, regional political and racial concerns, particularly regarding anti-Semitism.

The Leo Frank case catalyzed significant growth of several sociopolitical organizations.

The first of these was the Anti-Defamation League of the B'nai B'rith, founded in 1913. Although the creation of the ADL preceded the Leo Frank case, Frank's experience bolstered the belief that American Jews needed an organization that would challenge American anti-Semitism.

The second was the Ku Klux Klan, which was revived in Georgia at the end of the Leo Frank trial.

Let us do our part to make sure that the letters, written by Leo Frank to his wife from his jail cell, along with other correspondence, do not fade and deteriorate. Help to ensure their continued research value by digitization at the Brandeis University Library.
