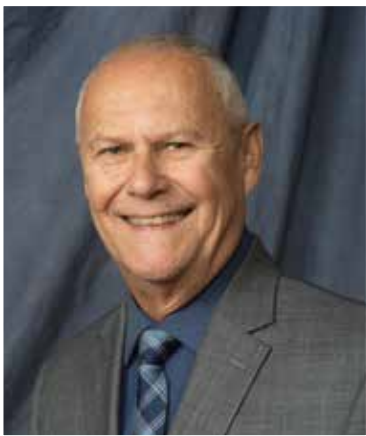


## AAIM BOARD OF DIRECTORS

I was born and raised in Rogers Park on the far north side of Chicago. After graduating from Notre Dame High School in Niles I received a degree in Mechanical Engineering from the Illinois Institute of Technology. I married my high school sweetheart, Cathy, right after graduation and we moved to Rhode Island where I attended graduate school at Brown University and Worcester Institute of Technology. After receiving my Master's degree we returned to Illinois with two new children and I began working for Teletype Corporation as a manufacturing engineer. In 1966 we bought a four bedroom home in Des Plaines. Cathy and I had five more children in rapid succession over the next nine years and we ended up putting an addition on our home to provide more living space. We ended up with three boys and four girls. I worked for Teletype for seven years before quitting my job in June of 1973. At the time we had five children and a pop-up camper. We bundled the children into our station wagon and spent the summer out west living out of the camper and visiting all the national parks. When we returned in the fall I found a new job at Chicago Metallic Corporation, a manufacturer of suspended ceiling systems. I worked for Chicago Metallic for the next 29 years and eventually became Manager of Manufacturing Engineering with a staff of 28 engineers, tool and die makers and maintenance men. I retired in 2002, a year after our youngest daughter, Theresa, was killed by a drunk driver. After Theresa's death I joined AAIM and became Treasurer in 2003. I have been Treasurer for the last 18 years and I have also been involved in several local community organizations. For the first eight years after Theresa's death Cathy and I ran an annual walk in her honor to raise money for AAIM and a scholarship in Theresa's honor at Wauconda High School. Through the generosity of our friends and family we have been able to donate \$55,000 to the AAIM Victim Assistance Fund, \$24,000 to the Scholarship Fund and \$20,000 to purchase iPods and heart monitors for use in Wauconda High School physical education classes.
