What will you see at the Expo; both new digital equipment and old amateur radio equipment (sometimes known as boat anchors). There is also a mobile set up that highlights all of the electromagnetic spectrum, which includes getting hands on with the equipment. One of the demonstrations includes equipment that can contact the space station. Most of the astronauts are amateur radio operators and if conditions are right, you might have a one to one conversation. The vendors also have parts and equipment to build your electronic projects.

One of the programs that is available for students under 18 provides all of the equipment* (including a transceiver) to be able to enjoy the exciting world of amateur radio (also called Hams). You can sign up at the outdoor mobile unit. A number of students who started in amateur radio have found that the basics ham radio lead to rewarding careers.
