

## **RARITIES**
























THIS TREE STUMP UMBRELLA STAND BY JAMES VAN METER WHITE HALL.ILL WILLIAM H TETER SR. A VETERAN OF THE CIVIL WAR DIED AT THE HOME OF HIS DAUGHTER.MRS A B SMITH ON E BRIDGEPORT STREET OF WHITE HALLAT THE RIPE OLD AGE OF 86 YEAR.MR TETER WAS BORN IN ROSS COUNTY OHIO AND AT THE AGE OF 15 YEARS HE MOVED TO ILLINOIS WHERE FOR MANY YEARS WAS WORKING WITE HIS PARENTS. IN 1864 HE ENLISTED WITH THE 91 ST ILLINOIS INFANTRY HE WAS LATER TRANSFERRED TO THE 28TH INF. PARTIEIDATED IN THE BATTIE OF SPANIANFORT. FORT BLAKELY AND OTHER ENGAGERMENTS. ATTHE CLOSING OF THE CIVIL WAR HE RECEIVED HIS HONORABLE DISCHARGE AND HAD SINCE MOVED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF WHITE HALL. IN 1855HE AND MISS SUSANNA PINKERTON WERE MARRID AN CHILDREN. IN 1877 HE MET A MAN BY THE NAME OF A.F. VEDDER. MR VEDDER PURCHASED THE DAVIS POTTERY FROM MURPHY& BATES. THE SAME YEAR IN1878 MR. VEDDER LEASED THE SHOP TO WILLIAM TETER SR AND HIS SON AND LAW WILLIAM WILCOX IN 1878 THE TETER&WILCOX POTTERY SHOP BEGINS MAKING TERRA COTTA FLOWER POTS. HANGING BASKETS AND ORNAMENTAL ART POTTERY. BOTH WERE SKILLED WORKMAN AND THERE PRODUCTS WERE CONSIDERED (HIGH CLASS GOODS) IN 1879MR VEDDER SOLD HIS SHOP TO WILLIAM TETER SR AND WILLIAM WILCOX STONEWARE. IN 1880THAY SOLD THE SHOP TO MC GOWAN, GALHULY&O, GORMAN THE SAME YEAR BECOMES SOLE OWNER OF THE POTTERY IN THIS TIME MR. TETER STAYED THERE WORKING IN1888 MCGOWAM SOLD TO VERMILLIONS BROTHERS SOLD IT TO H.C.MORROW IN 1903that same year the plant burns down.than thay rebuilt and a new company formed the white hall sewer pipe and stoneware co.mr. TETER AT THE AGE OF 56MADE THE UN\_ BRELLA STAND AND ON THE BOTTEM SAYS COMPLIMENTS W.H.TETER NOV. 30 1891 .MR TETER DIED AUG¶ 1920 AT HIS DAUGHTERS HOME ON E BIDGEPORT ST IN WHITE HALL ILL HIS DAUGHTER LIVED BY THE MAN I GOT IT FAOM WENE BRIS WAS LITTLE HIS MOTHER ETTA LYMAN WAS NABERS FRENDS OF THE FAMLY OF MR. TETERS DAUGHTER GAVE IT TO THEM THE UMBRELLA STAND WHEN ETTA LYMAN PASSET ON BOIS TOOK IT TO HIS HOME FOR 50 YEARS . ITSET ON THE FLOOR OF HIS BASEMENT WHEN HE SOLD IT TO ME WHAT A GREAT FIND .....














