

### MEN FOR BRANDEIS ACTIVITIES Wednesday, January 13 at 12:45 pm



On January 13, 2021, Dr. William (Bill) Hery will be discussing the historic work done at Bletchley Park in England during WWII. Dr. Hery is a retired computer scientist/engineer from Bell Labs, as well as a retired professor of electrical engineering from NYU's Tandon School of Engineering (formerly the Polytechnic Institute of Brooklyn).

Along the way, Bill developed a strong interest in the history of computing, cryptanalysis and Signals Intelligence (SIGINT). He has been to Bletchley Park twice to learn more of the history and explore the actual WWII artifacts. He wishes it was closer and not "across the pond," so he could visit more often.

Bletchley Park is famous for the vital work of Alan Turing and others in shortening WWII by decrypting German Enigma messages, which was only declassified starting in the late 1970s. This talk will give an overview of the history of this and other significant achievements, plus a few of the brilliant people behind those achievements. This includes the critically important decryption of the German High Command's Lorenz Network (used by Hitler and the top generals, only partially declassified starting 50 years after the fact), the "industrialization" of traffic analysis (now called metadata analysis) and intelligence processing, and the legacy of Bletchley Park's work on Cold War and later SIGINT organization and methodologies.

All meetings in 2020 will be conducted on Zoom. Members of the group who have RSVP'd to the facilitator will receive a Zoom link to attend. Please make sure in advance that the name on your computer or other device reads out accurately as your name, so that you can be recognized and admitted from Zoom's waiting room. 

Honoring Our History

The University Photography Collection

Regardless of your political affiliation, it is documented that Americans have made a historical choice in the election of the next President and Vice President. In light of our first woman - and a woman of color - to be Vice President, we will be highlighting the <u>Marcia Freedman Papers</u> that are part of the <u>American Jewish and Israeli Feminism Archives</u> <u>Collaborative</u> at the Brandeis Library.

The Marcia Freedman Papers consist of journals, lecture notes, correspondence, manuscripts, typescripts and research files created by Marcia Freedman, an American-Israeli activist and feminist. The collection also contains many articles about Freedman, including newspaper clippings, as well as book reviews for her memoir *Exile in the Promised Land*.

Of particular note are materials documenting her feminist roots, files relating to her election to the Knesset in Israel in 1973 and her founding of the Women's Party in Israel in 1977, as well as autobiographical writings throughout the collection. Material dates from the late 1960's to the 2010's. Audiovisual and born-digital mixed media files are also included. The Collection is predominantly in English although some clippings are in Hebrew and some European languages are also represented.

The <u>Honoring Our History</u> campaign goal is \$500,000 and at the time of this writing, we have added \$234,463 toward that goal.

The costs of digitizing and preserving each collection that we have highlighted throughout the past few months are: Leo Frank, \$20,000; Helmut Hirsch, \$40,000; Aviva Cantor, \$120,000; Photography Collection, \$10,000; Marcia Freedman, \$25,000.

It will require significant expenditures to make these and other collections permanent for future generations and scholars to use. Now that we are approaching a new year... please help us reach our goal and see your name and our chapter's name on the HOH virtual wall. You will also receive your own *Honoring Our History* pin for an individual donation starting at \$500.




