

It is a side-gabled structure but oriented perpendicularly to the street. Brick chimney is located in peak of gable end. Cedar shingles obscure wall treatment but evidence of beveled siding and a narrow frieze board can be seen. Windows are predominantly 1/1 with half-windows located under eaves.
