

## **Technical Fire Extinguishers**

It goes without saying tire extinguishers can minimize car-fire damage. They should be carried inside the car so you can get to it fast. Mount one between or under the front seats or on a panel under the dash next to the door. The key word here is "mount". You might not be able to find a loose extinguisher that has been rolling around.

Carrying one in the trunk is not the best idea. By the time you open the trunk and remove the extinguisher it could be too late.

In a TBird, putting it between the seat and the step plate is a handy position.

Check the extinguisher routinely for state of charge and operating condition.

## Report on CTCI Board of Directors Meeting February 3-4, 2017

The 2017 Board meeting was held at CTCI Headquarters in Signal Hill, CA.

The TARTC (The American Road Thunderbird Club) from Dearborn Michigan had delivered the Thunderbird invoices that they have maintained through the years, as promised. Last year we made a deal with them that CTCI would become custodians of these invoices and they delivered. The office had to make some preparations to house them and they did a wonderful job. CTCI is and will continue the sale of these invoices just as TARTC did.

Officers elected for the 2017 year are: President > Chuck Thompson, Vice President > John Smith, Secretary > Pocahontas Cole. Congratulations to all. Unfortunately we do not have a treasurer at this time. We do have someone interested and the Board is reviewing his background. The Board has decided to do an audit in the first quarter of 2018.

Unfortunately we lost 144 memberships last year over all, we have 5,233 members. Times are changing into an electronic world; we need your help with ideas how to attract new members. As we get older and sell our TBirds where are they going? We need to let these new owners know about the local clubs and CTCI and pass on the history behind these cars. If you have any ideas please pass them along to me as your Director I will see your message gets to those who can help.

This past year Chapter 7 Early Birds of Southern California and Chapter 24 Classic Thunderbirds of San Diego hosted the CTCI International Convention *Fun Fun in the California Sun* and it was a success, with 152 TBirds, and 563 people attending. As a result of such a great turn out they were able to return some of the seed money to those clubs who sent in money to help get them started. Congratulations to them. This year Chapter 41 New Jersey Open Road Thunderbird Club is stepping up once again to host this year CTCI Regional Convention. They are getting a huge response so far so if you plan to attend contact them asap. *Follow the Open Road to NJ 2017*, find info at www.ctci.org or www.njortc.org . They are planning a NYC Bus Tour ending up at the 911 Memorial & Museum, A Circle Line "Best of NYC" Boat Cruise, and much more!

In 2018 Chapter 116 The Smoky Mountain Classic Thunderbird Club will host the 2018 CTCI International Convention *Thunder 'n Lightnin in the Smokies* August 14-19, 2018 Knoxville TN. They are well on their way to putting together a bunch of wonderful things to do so please watch out for coming announcements. They will be at the NJ convention with more information.

There is no word on anyone stepping up to host a 2019 Convention. Won't you consider hosting? CTCI and NJ Open Road Thunderbird Club are both willing to assist you in putting together an event. Let's talk about it! NJ has experience; we hosted Regionals in 1991, 1998, 2007, and an International in 2002. Many of these members are still with us helping with their knowledge to put this year's 2017 convention together. CTCI purchased a temporary Event Management program to help with online registrations for conventions, NJ will be the first to use this then TN will use it. Jack Gray Managing Director at Headquarters office is looking to upgrade all systems in the office and hopes to have a more permanent event management program with it. This program is something each chapter can adapt their convention to so it will be easier to process registrations.

There were 12 Action Items needing attention that were assigned to teams from the 2016 Board, 8 of them were completed, 4 are still open being worked on. The 2017 Board has 19 Action Items assigned to teams to work on through the year. The Board is always looking for ways to keep up with the changing times and the electronic world and to make things easier and user friendly for our membership.

The online member roster went live earlier this year. Going online with the roster saved us over \$4000, it has been well received by the membership. Only 7 printed copies have been requested. The only complaint is members would like to set their own password, and that is being worked on.

Office Condo Complex News: Upgrades to the office such as new windows and fixtures with energy efficient bulbs were replaced at no cost to CTCI. The facility exterior repairs are ongoing, and our building will be completed in 2018-2019. The interior still needs paint and carpet, this is pending a budget and Treasurer. Liz Gray office Manager joined us as a full time employee officially in July. So when you call into CTCI say hi and welcome. Her grasp of the office flow and process, application of modern computer skills to the office work, her interaction with the members has been a benefit to CTCI.

Jack Gray Office managing Director has been with us now a little over 4 years, he continues to excel in his duties. He goes above and beyond and he is a part time employee. Even when not on the clock he is available to the Board anytime. Jack had some heavy duty tasks this year such as implementing the Thunderbird Invoices to CTCI Headquarters in Signal Hill, CA and what a great job he did. He is a great asset to CTCI.

The Early Bird Magazine was once again awarded the Golden Quill Award from Old Cars/Krause Publications. Now that our magazine is full publication it's been upgraded to the top class of awards called "National Luxury" This is the 13th award which is based on continued improvement. Congratulations to Editor Lin Somsack.

Thunderbird owners will be showing off their iconic Ford vehicles in a first ever "Thunderbird Appreciation Day" Sunday May 21st, 2017. The three large Thunderbird clubs; Classic Thunderbird Club International (CTCI), Vintage Thunderbird Club International (VTCI) and International Thunderbird Club (ITC) are encouraging their members to take their Thunderbirds out, individually or in groups, to places for the general-public to see, to learn more about and to just plain enjoy. In an effort to try and seek new members and to keep interest in the Little Birds CTCI and the Regional Directors are going to try and keep in closer contact with their chapters. 
