

Please come to all three evening talks if you can!





The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings with your children

We hear in today's Gospel that Jesus appears to the disciples on the evening of his resurrection. The disciples are grieving and terrified. After witnessing what happened to Jesus, they are afraid and wonder



whether they will be arrested, put on trial for a crime, imprisoned or killed. Then Jesus appears before them with a greeting of "Peace be with you." Jesus says to them, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

Jesus breathes on the disciples and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven."

When Jesus gives them the Holy Spirit, the disciples are changed. They are no longer afraid. They are eager to begin their mission. With the Holy Spirit, they are given the gifts they need to spread the Good News of Christ's resurrection, forgive sins and heal people.

People today are sent on missions. The Catholic Church had a long history of sending people out to do the work of Jesus, and these people are called missionaries. Missionaries are sent all over the world to do good works like bringing food, medical help, and education to areas of the world that need it the most. At the same time, they bring the Gospel message of Christ to the people every day.

We too are disciple of Christ by our Baptism. So, we too are sent on a mission. We can do the mission right

here in our community as we interact with the people around us.
