Our winter clothing swap is ongoing through the month of February. You can swap your gently-loved mittens, hats, coats, boots, and snow pants for the size you need.







The Plan's objectives are organized under the following goals:

Your child's teacher will be sending out a SignUpGenius Link for you to select your conference time. For families with more than one child we will work with you, as best we can to have conferences for both your children on the same day.

Here are some tips to get the most out of the conference experience.

- Conferences are an opportunity for your child's teacher to share a snapshot of your child in a school setting.
- Completing the Parent-Teacher Conference Survey sent home in your child's tote bag is a wonderful way to help your child's teacher focus the conference on the topics you'd like to cover during your conference time.
- Conferences are scheduled for 15 minutes. If you think you will need more than 15 minutes, please make special arrangements with your child's teacher in advance.
- Please be on time or notify the office if you are running late for your conference. Conferences are for adults only. Classes will be held during conferences. Babies are welcome to attend, however baby-sitting arrangements should be made for older siblings.
- As the Director of the school, I work with the teachers to ensure we are providing the best possible experience for your child. It's possible I will sit in on your child's conference to learn more about your child, support a teacher, offer ideas on your child's development. Please, do not worry if I'm at your conference. I am there as a resource, support, and educator, for your child and family.
- Please let me know if you have any questions or would like me to participate in your child's conference. Working together as a team is important to each child's progress in preschool.

Private School Options:

Many BHPCNS alumni and current families are exploring both public and private school options for their children. Within the BHPCNS community there are families whose children attend an array of private programs in our area, including but not limited to, St. Jane de Chantal, St. Bartholomew, Our Lady of Mercy, The Woods Academy, Brookwood School for Girls, Stone Ridge, Norwood School, Primary Day School, Bullis School, St. Andrews, and Washington Episcopal School. To explore the private school options, contact these schools as soon as possible to inquire about your child attending. BHPCNS will provide any supporting information requested to complete a child's application.

Montgomery County Public Schools:

The majority of BHPCNS families' children will enroll in Montgomery County Public Schools, MCPS. MCPS needs to know if your child will be attending one of their schools in the fall of 2023. To register your child for MCPS, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending for next fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September, the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall.

MRS. KEBLER'S GIRLS SCOUTS TROOP 5906





WHY CROSSING THE MIDLINE IS IMPORTANT

Have you ever wondered, "What is crossing the midline and why is it important?" Here's a brief description and a link to the entire article. The term crossing midline is often used to describe the skill of moving your arm or leg across the imaginary line down the middle of your body. You'll see this term used a lot by Occupational Therapists and other professionals when they are working with children who have a decrease in fine motor skills, gross motor skills, or handwriting problems. Here are Crossing the Midline Activities for Kids of All Ages:

- 1. Playing with rhythm scarves
- 2. Playing with blocks (stacking)
- 3. Dancing to music
- 4. Dusting or sweeping
- 5. Playing patty-cake
- 6. Playing with cars on a large path
- 7. Playing flashlight tag
- 8. Washing the car
- 9. Painting with a large roller
- 10. Completing cross crawls (touching hand to opposite foot or knee)
- 11. Wiping off a table with a towel using one hand
- 12. Throwing a water balloon or bean bag or ball at a target
- 13. Drawing a large figure 8 on a chalkboard or sidewalk
- 14. Playing Simon Says
- 15. Playing Twister

If MCPS has a two hour delay, BHPCNS will begin the school day at 11:00 am, except for Early Morning with Bradley Bear students who may arrive at 10:00 am. Students in the 2-year-old program may stay until 12:30 pm. Lunch Bunch will be cancelled. We will provide a hearty snack. Stay & Play will be held.

If MCPS closes schools early, BHPCNS will close at 11:30 for the 2s, 12:30 for 2-year-olds who participate in Lunch Bunch, 12:30 for the 3-year-old and Pre-K classes. Stay & Play will be cancelled.

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE (3-year-old & Pre-K) with Mrs. Goodstein

Weekly Church Services - We are holding in-person church services at 8:30 and 10:30 with Virtual Worship Services at 10:30 am on Sundays at <u>this link</u>. We also offer "Children's Church" in person for ages 3- fifth grade during the service (see details below).



Sunday Nursery Services during church – We offer care for young children during worship. Caregivers are fully vaccinated and boostered when eligible as well as wear N-95 masks. Children age two and up are encouraged to wear a mask. For children two years old and younger, there is a limit of six children total. When there are three-year-olds, there is a limit of nine children total. Only adult caregivers are allowed in the nursery space. Windows are cracked open for ventilation.

Children's Church School: After the Children's Message in the sanctuary (between 10:45 and 10:50 am), all children ages 3 – 5th grade are invited to join our classes which are being held outside when possible. Children aged 3 – 2nd grade will participate in the Godly Play model of church school with experienced teachers who are trained in that model. Children in 3rd-5th grade will participate in a different curriculum geared to their age group. Masks and physical distancing are required for all participants as we encounter God's word together and respond with prayer, thanksgiving, and creative projects.
