On February 4th the SIGP's Anti Human Trafficking Committee (HT) met to close out the 2019 5K Walk/Run event. The committee decided to split the proceeds between Phoemale (\$1575), which was the recipient of last year's Ruby Award, and Elli's House (\$1575). Elli's House is a shelter for runaway or homeless women involved in sex trafficking in the city of Detroit.

Deb Ellinger, Executive Director and Founder of Elli's House is delighted and honored to be a recipient of our hard work and energy to bring awareness to our community about human trafficking.

Deb stated that her organization's greatest needs are the following items: flip flops, leggings, travel size wipes and deodorant. BOARD MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES 2020

POSITIONS AVAILABLE FOR THE 2020-2022 TERM ARE:

PRESIDENT, PRESIDENT-ELECT, VICE PRESIDENT, SECRETARY AND 2 DIRECTORS

The President shall

- 1. Direct the conduct of the business of the Club;
- 2. Set meeting agendas for Club and Board meetings;
- 3. Preside at Club and Board meetings;
- 4. Oversee all committees, working closely with the President-Elect and Vice-President;
- 5. Be an ex-officio member of all committees, except nominating;
- 6. Sign all checks in the absence of the treasurer;
- 7. Appoint delegates from a list of district, region, Federation, or International meetings;
- 8. Serve as the club delegate at district, region, Federation, and International meetings, or appoint an alternate from a list of meeting attendees.

The President-Elect agrees (program chair)

- 1. To assume the office of president at the end of her two-year term;
- 2. Shall be responsible for program of service committees;
- 3. Shall have such duties and powers as arise from membership on the board or as assigned by the president or the Board.

The Vice-President shall (membership chair)

- 1. Be responsible for the planning of member development activities;
- 2. Be responsible for organizing membership recruitment activities;
- 3. Maintain a roll of membership (directory);
- 4. Be responsible for conducting new member survey and member survey annually;
- 5. Shall have such duties and powers as arise from membership on the Board or as assigned by the President or the Board.

The Secretary shall

- 1. Keep the minutes of the Club and the Board meetings;
- 2. Be custodian of The Club's permanent records;
- 3. Submit to the membership the minutes of the business meetings and the recommendations of the Board;
- 4. Submit to the Board the minutes of the Board meetings;
- 5. Send out notices and carry on such correspondence as does not properly belong to other officers.

The Assistant Secretary shall (public awareness chair)

- 1. Maintain a log of attendance at Club business meetings;
- 2. Fulfill the responsibilities of the secretary in her absence;
- 3. Perform any other duties assigned by the president or the secretary;

About Dr. Nina Smart: Keynote Speaker at Midwestern Conference in Ann Arbor



Dr. Nina Smart is a non-violent human rights activist, sociologist and author who educates people about female genital mutilation (FGM) and works to eradicate the practice in Sierra Leone, West Africa, and right here in California. In 2004, Dr. Smart founded Servicing Wild Flowers—SWF International, a Los Angeles-based nonprofit NGO that raises awareness about FGM through lectures and presentations for students, immigrants and socially conscious groups. She works directly in rural areas of Sierra Leone, together with SWF partners, who facilitate community meetings addressing FGM and with International organizations that hold consultative status with the United Nations. She contributed towards the first FGM Summit in the US, participates in the End FGM network and has recently launched the FGM Taskforce in L.A.

A proud Soroptimist and enthusiastic volunteer in both African and Romanian communities, Dr. Smart was chosen as 2016 "Woman of the Year" for her nonprofit work by Senator Mendoza of California and honored by the United States Congress. She proudly represents SI Downey at the region and federation levels highlighting the contributions made by Downey Soroptimists in their communities. In her role as Camino Real Region Chair of International Advocacy, Dr. Smart uses her expertise in world polity transmission to share information about the role SI plays in shaping international laws affecting the lives of women and girls through the United Nations. A repeat SI delegate to the Commission on the Status of Women, Dr. Smart is also passionate to raise awareness about SI President's Appeal for the 2019-2021—The Road to Equality. She donates 50% of her book


