A Word from the Pastor

This past week I was playing a board game with Ashley, Luke, Mary, and Hannah. The game was Settlers of Catan. The point of the game is to earn ten points by building settlements using the games resources. Throughout the game you can trade resources with the other players in the game. For example if the resource of wheat is scarce (based on the dice roll) then you might be able to trade a wheat card for two or more resources of wood. We were playing and I was getting close to winning. I needed one specific resource card to be able to win and everyone seemed to know that. It was Luke's turn and I knew he had the resource card I needed so I offered him basically my whole hand, four or five cards for the one card that I needed. Immediately Ashley and Mary and Hannah began telling him not to trade with me because I was going to win the game. But Luke looked at the plentiful amount of resources I was offering and gladly handed over the one resource I needed. I won the game. After which Ashley and Luke's sisters gave him a hard time about why would he trade with me when I was about to win. It was at this point that Ashley said, "Luke, you are just like Adam and Eve, you're too greedy".

That phrase stuck with me because I never thought of Adam and Eve as greedy, though that seems to have played a role in the decision to eat the forbidden apple. As I thought about that I realized my son fell victim to the age-old human blunder of short-sightedness based on short term gifts. It is the story of the Lorax again and again. The wealthy business owner pollutes and destroys their home town just to make a few extra dollars now. Thus, they forsake their future in the community and gain something they didn't need in the first place.

Or the teenager who spends all their money on the latest electronic but then has no money left to put gas in the car to get to work to earn more money. We see short-sighted decisions all the time from fortune 500 business dealings to homeless on the street. It seems to be human nature to bite the delicious looking apple in front of us without thinking about its impact down the road.

I wonder how our faith might be different if we could take a more holistic long-term approach? If we thought not in terms of immediate success or even family success and started thinking about the success of the Kingdom of God. God's kingdom is on a much longer time frame than our individual lives. What if we thought not about what will help me get ahead today and instead thought what is best for humanity, for the community, for the world, tomorrow. It is just another way of thinking about others over ourselves. It is a way of thinking that prioritizes the results for all over the immediate pleasures of one.

To do this will not be easy. We are fighting against thousands of years of human tendency. But since it is our goal to spend eternity with our Lord and Savior, it might benefit us to think in those terms rather than fulfilling foolish longings and wants today. Matthew 6:19-21 says, "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." I guess the question is; where is your treasure?
