

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

In 3:13-17

"Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up...so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life" (Jn 3:14-15) A powerful story about Moses in the desert tells of the time that the people were plagued by biting serpents that killed many of the Israelites. They called out for help, and God answered them by directing Moses to kill a serpent and place it high upon a stake. Even just looking at the staked serpent, became a healing remedy for those afflicted with serpent fears or injuries (Numbers 21:9). Similarly, we call out to God with complaints of how 'angst-causing death' stalks us, and God provides a visual remedy of Christ hung up, on the Cross for us. We gaze upon it and experience comfort and healing. If we recall that one of the consequences of Adama & Eve's sin in the garden was suffering and death, then we can see that Christ on the Crucifix undoes the damage of Adama & Eve. The snake-bitten pain (suffering in this life) passed on to us from Adam and Eve's act of stealing fruit from the tree, is healed by Christ's return to the tree of the stolen fruit (Jesus on cross is the restored fruit on the tree--His obedience redeems the disobedience of Adam). This restitution-redemption (Son of Man lifted up on tree of cross) restores our best relationship to God and His Garden (God Creator & His Design for our Life & Being). Jesus willingly rose up onto the cross for us, accepting death that we might live. It is something to see! Look up at a crucifix! We must *face* the reality of sin's pain and suffering in this world in order to *overcome* it. Often, that includes facing our own part to play in bringing it on. But by acknowledging it, we begin the process of its redemption--like exposing a wound to the healing effects of daylightsunshine. Having faced our wound openly, when can begin healing it.

Jesus' restoration of human obedience to Father's Will restores/heals us by properly relating again to God, as God intended from the beginning. The Book of Revelation 22:2 tells us of the new heaven and new earth, where "the tree of life produces fruit twelve times a year... the leaves of the trees serve as <u>medicine for the nations</u>." The cross of Jesus is the true tree of life, and it blooms and fruits our healing remedy! Isn't it amazing to consider how, when we eat the new fruit of the cross-tree of life with Jesus on it now, we can say this new fruit brings eternal life back to us. In John 6:40 "everyone who sees the Son {looks upon Him} and believes in him may have eternal life" and in John 6:54, Jesus says "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day." Jesus is the fruit on the Tree of Life that we look upon, as He is raised up in front of us in every Mass at Communion, just before we are invited to come receive Him and live a healed life from Him ('Only say the Word, and my soul shall be healed')! What a sacred gift!

I was blessed a couple of years ago, to hear the 'witness story' of young man who had converted to the Catholic Faith from Buddhism. He had always been perplexed and put off by the Catholic Faith and the everpresent image of a crucifix of our Lord around sanctuaries or in our literature. He happened to be looking at a rosary one day and holding the crucifix piece one day, when an enlightening thought hit his heart - "This crucified Lord embodies what I profess we seek release from in Buddhism. Suffering in this life! The four Truths of Buddhism (central tenets) are 1) Life is suffering 2) The cause of suffering is Desire, 3) End Desire & then Suffering ends 4) The elimination of desire results from following the Eightfold Path of Rightness (1. Right Understanding, 2. Right Intent, 3. Right Speech, 4. Right Action, 5. Right Livelihood, 6. Right Effort, 7. Right Mindfulness & 8. Right Concentration). He came to realize that Jesus Christ fulfills that redemption of Suffering, by His loving sacrifice of death on the Cross – embracing it fully out of live for us and showing us the Way of Following Him (the Path = Jesus' 1 am the Way. Truth and Life' Jn 14:6). Of course, there is a lot more historical background to the young man's wonderful conversion story, but his breakthrough 'moment of realization' came after holding and meditating upon that suffering crucifix image of Jesus raised up upon the cross! It is our sign of salvation and the sign we follow: the sign of Christ on the Cross (1 Cor 1:23-24,Gal 6:14).
