#### **Governance & Organization of the Congregational Church**


Doctrine refers to the belief (Baptist) of your church. Polity is the way your church has chosen to "bring people together" to live out your belief.

As Baptists, we are autonomous, congregational bodies which means that we celebrate being distinct, diverse, and different in our organizational structures and forms of governance. However, regardless of your church's form of governance or structure of organization, you, as a church leader must be united in how you act and conduct yourselves to live out your Christian beliefs.

Church leaders with differing polities within the same church will inevitably lead to factions and divisions within the body. *Bringing* people together begins with church leaders and congregations *Being* together as one body. It is difficult and nearly impossible for divided church leaders to unite others in the Spirit of Christ.


#### **Baptist Polity & Church Governance**

## **The Baptist Church Covenant**

**Covenant:** 1. the **conditional promises** made to humanity by God, as revealed in Scripture. 2. to **promise** by covenant; pledge. 3. an **agreement**, formal, between two or more persons to do or not do something specified. (**Definition from** <a href="https://www.thefreedictionary.com/covenanted">https://www.thefreedictionary.com/covenanted</a>.)

As One Body in Christ is the commitment we have made to each other AND most importantly, to God regarding the way we will live, lead, and serve as Baptist believers. It speaks to Bringing People Together and is the key phrase of faith from within our covenant that describes our promise and commitment to God.
