Wellton Show January 19–20 near Yuma, AZ


Merry Christmas!


Buzz Box



Years ago I was playing with a buzz box for one of me old engines and asked Gene DeCamp for some help. This diagram is from Gene.

Rotary valve design, 1893.

In the late 18 's F.E. Tremper created a few designs and this image is his rotary Valve system for what he called the "Explosive Engine". It was a rotary disk that would move to provide the Intake or the Exhaust companent of the cylinder. As you can see from the diagram, a chain drive ran from the crankshaft connecting to the rotary valves shaft. This design had No poppet valves, and fewer moving parts.



Tremper's design for a rotary valve was integrated into his original patent. "Fig. 3" shows the ports in the cylinder, with "P" and "P4" representing the disc valve and valve port, respectively. "Fig. 4" shows the ports in the valve body. The valve could also be head-mounted, chain driven through bevel gears, as shown in "Fig. 5."
