Undesignated donations go to support grants to clubs that have projects that are too large to handle on their own, such as assisting a local resident with a surgery, purchasing a prosthetic eye, purchasing PediaVision equipment for Early Childhood Vision Screening to name only a few.

The *Friend of the Foundation* donations will go for these purposes: **operating expenses and matching fund grants to local clubs.** *Each year a donation is given, a numbered "dangler" (representing the number of years donations have been made) will be given to the donor to add to their "Friends" pin.*

Please note, you do not need to be a Lion to be a *Friend of the Foundation*.



Rocky Mountain Lions Eye Bank and Institute Foundation

Beginning with a hand-ful of donors providing an average of seven cornea transplants a month, the eye bank is now one of the the world's largest. In 2000, the eye bank restored sight to over 2,000 people in eleven different countries.



Early Childhood Vision Screening

This program has as its goal to screen pre-school children using a special stereo Polaroid camera that can help identify correctible vision problems such as amblyopia. If diagnosed at an early age, these conditions may be successfully treated. Otherwise they may become lifelong handicaps.

Lions of Wyoming Foundation

The LoWF works with the Rocky Mountain Lions Eye Bank and Eye Institute Foundations and the Lions Clubs of Wyoming to provide grants to allow citizens of Wyoming receive treatment for and assistance with visual and auditory problems that they might not otherwise be able to afford. In addition, the Foundation partners with local clubs to provide needed equipment or assist in funding community-wide programs that may benefit visually or hearing impaired.

The Foundation is the charitable arm of Wyoming Lions. Since 1983, the Foundation has been building its resources while providing assistance to local Clubs in their efforts to assist citizens in their communities. The LoWF, working through local Lions Clubs has provided support to assist citizens with disabilities in receiving surgery, prosthetics, computer software, therapy and Leader Dogs.

Programs supported by the Lions of Wyoming Foundation

Allen H. Stewart Lions Camp

Located on Casper Mountain, south of Casper, Wyoming, the Lions Camp serves children and adults with summer camps that provide training in the basic skills required to for a blind person to function independently in a sighted world.



Leader Dog

Leader Dog is located in Rochester, Michigan. Dogs are bred, raised and trained to be companions that help visually impaired persons move with confidence in their world.




Lions International Foundation
