Harmonica Musings:

I practice and practice on my harmonica and finally I learn a song. Sometimes I say to myself "Wow... cool, this music sound's awesome!" And then, occasionally, I have the good sense to record myself and then listen to my composition. Upon hearing myself play, I'll often recognize obvious problems. That transition from one part of the song to another sounds awful, or no...I am just not playing the melody or rhythm correctly. All I am saying is that listening to yourself, is an incredible educational tool. If on the phone or your computer you are able to record and listen to your own music... you will quickly be able to make appropriate and sometimes wonderful corrections to the songs you are playing. Try it out.
