Presentation purpose:

Patients experiencing a stroke, cardiovascular event or undergoing TAVR require initiation of antiplatelet therapy. Choosing an optimal regimen is essential in decreasing both rates of thrombosis and bleeding. Recently published literature may challenge current guideline recommendations for the use of antiplatelet agents following ischemic stroke, acute coronary syndrome and TAVR.

- Discuss updates in literature for the management of antiplatelet therapy post ischemic stroke
- Compare current guidelines for antiplatelet therapy after acute coronary syndrome to recommendations from recent literature
