Candidate Programs: Educate & Inform



AS STATED IN OUR BYLAWS: "AZFRW SHALL REFRAIN FROM SUPPORTING ANY CANDIDATE IN A PRIMARY ELECTION CONTEST. THIS APPLIES ONLY TO AZFRW AND ITS CLUBS. INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS MAY SUPPORT ANY REPUBLICAN CANDIDATE OF THEIR CHOICE." DOES THIS MEAN WE CAN'T HAVE CANDIDATES IN CONTESTED PRIMARIES ATTEND OUR MEETINGS PRE-PRIMARY?

A CANDIDATE ISN'T A CANDIDATE UNTIL SIGNATURES ARE FILED AND THEY ARE OFFICIALLY ON THE BALLOT. RECOMMEND THAT CLUBS BE SURE THAT A "CANDIDATE" WISHING TO SPEAK PRIOR TO SIGNATURE SUBMITTALS HAS FILED PAPERWORK WITH THE APPROPRIATE ENTITY

AZFRW CLUBS DO A GREAT JOB BRINGING CANDIDATE SPEAKERS TO THEIR RESPECTIVE MEMBERSHIP

- Make sure they are Republicans!

Ballot Initiatives

- 3 Types of Changes All Require Petition Signatures
 - Constitutional 5
 - Initiative 20 plus
 - Recall 2
- Most don't make it to the ballot due to the number of valid signatures required
- Some common ones we are seeing include Legalizing Marijuana, Dream Act AZ, Dark Money, Toll Roads, Classroom Code of Ethics, Invest in Ed, Automatic Voter Reg, Fair Elections
- Signatures all due in July
- Typically good program months for Pro's/Con's on Ballot Initiatives are after the August Primary
- Be mindful of Propositions on your respective ballots regarding bond overrides, city tax increases, etc.
