

Kiley's Shag Tail Worm



The Slow Rolla Tail is very versatile and can be used on many different patterns (Wooly Buggers, Spoon Fly, streamers, Kiley's Shag Worm). This tail is very durable and has been fielded on both fresh water and salt water fish. The Slow Rolla tail is offered in three different sizes, Small (Hook Sizes 6-12), Medium (Hook Sizes 1-4) and Large (hook Sizes 1/0 and up).

Recipe for Kiley's Shag Worm:

Hook: TMC5262 sizes 4-12

Thread: Mono

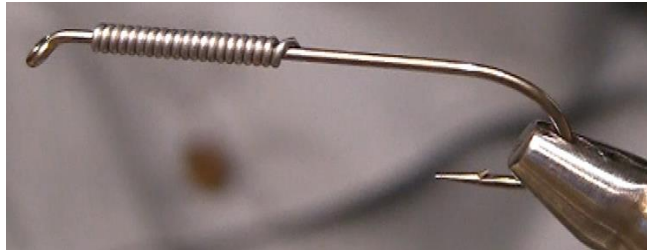
Weight: .025 lead Wire

Buoyancy: Foam

Tail: Kiley's Slow Rolla Tail

Body: Cohen's Carp Dubbing

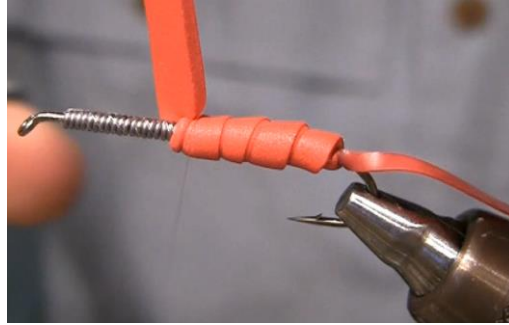
1. Start about the 90% point and wrap the lead wire to the 50% point of the hook shank.



2. Tie the thread in at the hook eye and then wrap back to the bend of the hook. Cover the lead wraps with thread.
3. Tie in the tail at the bend of the hook. Tie in the larger end of the tail to the hook shank.



4. Tie in the foam at the bend of the hook and then wrap it to 50%-60% of the hook shank. Tie it off with the thread and then trim. Bring the thread to the rear of the hook.



5. Rough Dub the body in segments to the hook eye. Using the mono thread go back over the body to reinforce it. This will help for step 7 when the body is brushed out.
6. Whip finish



7. Use a piece of Velcro to brush out the worm.
