Professor of American Studies at Brandeis University Comes to Phoenix

SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY:


Thomas Doherty, a professor of American studies, is a cultural historian with a special interest in Hollywood cinema. He teaches courses in media culture and things American. He is currently serving as chairman of the program.

Doherty's undergraduate degree is from Gonzaga University, a small liberal arts college in Spokane, WA, similar to Brandeis but with different religious holidays. After a two-year stint in the Peace Corps in South Korea, he entered graduate school at the University of Iowa, where he earned a Ph.D. in American studies in 1984.

After teaching in the division of humanities at Boston University, he came to Brandeis in 1990. He has also taught overseas as a Fulbright scholar at Ewha Womans University in Seoul, South Korea, and as the Thomas

Jefferson Chair in American Studies at the University of Groningen in the Netherlands.

As a senior Fulbright scholar, Doherty has lectured in New Zealand and Albania. His reviews and commentary have appeared



in the Boston Globe, the Los Angeles Times and the Washington Post, and he writes frequently on media culture for the Chronicle of Higher Education. In 2005, he received recognition as an Academy Film Scholar from the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences.

Doherty is the author of Teenagers and Teenpics: The Juvenilization of American Movies in the 1950s (1988), Projections of War: Hollywood, American Culture and World War II (1993), Pre-Code Hollywood: Sex, Immorality and Insurrection in American Cinema, 1930-1934 (1999), Cold War, Cool Medium: Television, McCarthyism and American Culture (2003) and Hollywood's Censor: Joseph I. Breen and the Production Code Administration (2007). His most recent book is Hollywood and Hitler. 1933-1939.

He serves on the editorial board of Cineaste and edits the film review section for the *Journal of American History*.

He and his wife, Sandra, a freelance editor and fierce Pittsburgh Steelers fan, live in Salem, Massachusetts.

After three years of sea duty, she moved inland to Nevada where she flew search and rescue with the H-1 Huey helicopter and is credited with 31 lives saved. Anne and her crew garnered the accolade Helicopter Aircrew of the Year in 1997, an award given for search and rescue, for rescuing 13 people in the 100 year flood that affected the area surrounding Reno, Nevada and Yosemite.







Brandeis Acquires Lilith Archives, Cornerstone to Jewish Feminist Collections

With 40 cubic feet of boxes containing 800 files ranging from AIDS to Zionism, the newly acquired Lilith Archives at the Robert D. Farber University Archives & Special Collections tells pathbreaking stories from the lives of Jewish women over the past four decades.

Behind the stories are still other stories, all contained in these boxes. It is nothing less than the "concrete evidence of the changes that have taken place in 40 years -- both in the women's movement and in Jewish life. Lilith has both borne witness and spurred those

changes along," said Susan Weidman '65, one of the founding mothers of Lilith.

The stories within show how a magazine can form a "connective tissue" for women around the world and give voice to their issues. They show how a group of pioneering women journalists with little business experience started a nonprofit social-change-oriented periodical from scratch, learning as they went.

"We hope many of these documents will be inspirational to other feminist start-ups," Schneider said.


