FATHER SAM'S CORNER

October 14, 2018

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gospel: Mark 10: 17-30

Too much attachment to the gifts detaches the receiver from the Giver.

Today's Gospel challenged a young rich man to choose between his wealth and salvation. The young rich man who claimed to have been keeping all the commandments asked Jesus what to do further to enter the Kingdom of God. Jesus looked at him kindly and noticed he was lacking in love and charity because he was too much attached to his wealth. Jesus might have discovered that the material attachment would risk the young man his salvation so he ordered him to sell them off, give the proceeds to the poor and become his disciple. Perhaps that was the only way Jesus could guarantee the rich man's salvation. By responding this way Jesus seemed to put the rich man in a position to choose between material attachment and giving his wealth up for charity for the sake of his salvation. To Jesus' greatest surprise the rich man angrily left the scene. His actions seemed to indicate he preferred material attachment to his salvation.

Considering this rich man's material attachment, and reaction, Jesus turned to his disciples and observed: "See how hard it is for a rich man to enter into the Kingdom of God". By this remark Jesus did not opine that all the rich people are excluded from the Kingdom of God, or cursed, for good wealth is a blessing from God. Rather, he was advising his followers to avoid every material attachment for it will make their realization of salvation very hard, as observed in the life of the rich man in question.

Perhaps after observing the entire event and having seen how many people in their community that were entangled by material possessions, the disciples then wondered who would be saved if what their master said about the rich man should be the case. Probably out of fear of losing their own salvation after giving all they had for the sake of following Christ, Peter asked their Master, what about us who have left everything to follow you? To reassure them that their salvation is intact, Jesus answered Peter and said: "Amen, I say to you, no one who has given up" anything "for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now, (all that were given up), in this present age, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come" (Mark 10:29-30). With this statement Jesus invites us to a self reflection on how attached and detached we are to our gifts from God. Material attachment occurs wherever or whenever love for a gift trumps the love for the giver and neighbor. It is good for a person to attach his life with his gifts to God. For when a receiver attaches his/her life to the giver (God), the gifts are seen as the means to serve God, self and neighbor. But when a life is focused on any gift alone, the gift becomes an end. Let us continue to serve God, ourselves and neighbors with our gifts, for the more we do so the closer we are to the giver (God) and His Kingdom.

Evangelio: Marcos 10: 17-30

Mucho apego a lo material diferencian al receptor del dador.

En el Evangelio de hoy, a un joven rico se le pide que escoja entre su riqueza y salvacion. El joven rico, quien clamaba haber respetado todos los mandamientos, preguntaba a Jesus sobre como entrar al Reino de Dios. Jesus, lo miraba amablemente y observaba en su corazon la carencia del amor y caridad porque estaba muy apegado a su riqueza. Jesus, pudo descubrir en el joven rico que el apego a lo material podria poner en riesgo su salvacion, entonces le ordeno a el desprenderse de toda riqueza, dar su dinero a los pobres y seguirlo a El como Discipulo. Quizas ese era el unico camino que le garantizaba su salvacion. Respondiendo de esta manera Jesus miraba la forma de poner en el corazon del hombre rico carente de amor y Caridad, escojer entre su salvacion y su riqueza por el bienestar de su salvacion. La sorpresa fue grande para Jesus ya que el hombre rico desaparecio de la escena muy disgustado. Sus acciones indican que el hombre rico preferia su riqueza a su salvacion.

Considerando el apego de este hombre rico a lo material, y a su reaccion, Jesus miraba a sus Discipulos y les dice: “ Vean cuan duro es para un hombre rico entrar al Reino de Dios”. Pero, Jesus, sin embargo remarcaba que en su opinion no todos los ricos estaban excluidos del Reino de Dios, o maldecidos, que el bienestar material tambien es una bendicion de Dios. Mas bien, El estaba aconsejando a sus seguidores conservar algo material en caso de que no pudiesen seguir con su salvacion, pues, era un camino muy duro, como lo observamos en la actitud del hombre joven rico.

Quizas luego de observar todos los eventos y habiendo visto como mucha gente entre su comunidad estaban tan apegados a sus posesiones materiales, los Discipulos se imaginaban quien quisiera ser salvado tal y como lo decia el Maestro en el caso del joven rico. Probablemente, el no tener miedo de perder nuestra propia salvacion luego de dar todo lo que tenemos por nuestro bien y para ser seguidor de Cristo, Pedro pregunto al Maestro, que sera de nosotros que hemos dejado todo lo que tenemos para seguirte? El les dice que su salvacion esta intacta, Jesus respondio a Pedro y le dijo: “Amen, yo les digo, ninguno que ha renunciado” ninguno “por mi salvacion y por la salvacion de la palabra de Dios dejara de recibir el ciento por uno y mas” (a todo a lo que han renunciado), en esta era, con persecuciones y la vida eterna por venir” (Marcos 10:29-30). Con este testimonio Jesus nos invita a una libre reflexion sobre como apegarnos y despegarnos a todo lo que son presentes de Dios. Apegos materiales ocurren donde sea y cuando sea que este el amor por lo que damos a nuestros semejantes. Es bueno para un hombre dar su vida como un presente a Dios. Pero cuanto un receptor da su vida el o ella al dador (Dios), el presente como hemos visto significa servir a Dios, darse uno mismo al proximo. Pero cuando una vida esta enfocada solo al regalo, el regalo comienza con un fin y eso no quiere decir que sea el fin. Vamos a continuar sirviendo a Dios, nosotros mismos y a nuestro proximo con nuestros dones, por estar mas y mas cerca al dador y su Reino.
