

If you or any of your staff are feeling sick (any cold or flu-like symptoms), do not come to the market or handle any produce. Symptoms of Covid-19 include:

- A new fever (100.4° or higher), or a sense of having a fever
- A new cough that you cannot contribute to another health condition
- New shortness of breath that you cannot attribute to another health condition
- New muscle aches that you cannot attribute to another health conditions or that may have been caused by a specific activity (such as physical exercise)

ALL vendors who attend the market must commit to the following:

- Wear a cloth face covering, as applicable, in accordance with WA State Health Department guidance.
- Arrange your booth to encourage distance and direct the flow of customers. Consider displaying a large sign that lists everything you have available (like a "menu") so shoppers are prepared when they enter your booth.
- Offer hand sanitizer (at least 60% alcohol per CDC) or use of a gravity-flow handwash station to customers.
- Ask for exact change when possible or use payment options like credit cards, or hands-free payments like Venmo or Paypal.
- Sanitize point-of-sale devices between each transaction.
- Minimize conversations with customers to focus on the transaction.
- Communicate social distancing protocols with customers at the market. Maintain 6 feet between customers and other vendors.
- Frequently clean tables and other high-contact surfaces.
- Put-up social distancing signage for customers (Ferndale Market has signs to provide to vendors).
- Review and are follow all state and county guidance related to COVID-19.
- Inform Market Board of unsafe situations requiring immediate attention.

Ferndale Market is taking the following public safety measures:

- Spreading out the spacing of vendor booths to increase social distancing.
- Increasing signage and other market infrastructure to assist with social distancing and customer communication.
- Monitoring the number of customers at the market and having one designated entrance and exit for customers creating a one-way flow.
- Providing signage around the market encouraging safe prevention methods.



Gravity Flow Handwashing Station Instructions

A **gravity flow handwashing station** is made up of:

- An insulated 5 gallon container with a continuous flow spigot filled with warm water between 100-120°F
- A wastewater bucket large enough to catch the water as you wash your hands
- Soap and paper towels.

Insulated containers that have a push button spigot must be retro-fitted with a continuous flow spigot. Often the push button spigot can be unscrewed from the insulated container and retrofitted with a continuous flow spigot. Insulated containers can be found at home improvement stores and sporting goods stores.



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
